5. <u>ILLUSTRATIVE AND/OR VERBAL PRESENTATION AGENDA ITEMS</u>

A 60th Anniversary Recognition of Partner in Service: Calleguas Municipal Water District

Mike McNutt, Public Affairs and Communications Manager, provided introductory remarks recognizing Calleguas Municipal Water District (Calleguas) as the District's Partner in Service.

Board President Peterson shared the history of the District's partnership with Calleguas Municipal Water District, and presented the 60th Anniversary Recognition of Partner in Service to Calleguas Directors Thomas Slosson and Andres Santamaria and General Manager Susan Mulligan.

Directors Thomas Slosson and Andres Santamaria, and General Manager Susan Mulligan expressed their appreciation for the District's longstanding relationship with Calleguas.

Director Lewitt arrived at 5:18 p.m.

B Legislative and Regulatory Updates

Joe McDermott, Director of Resource Conservation and Public Outreach, noted that a list of bills of interest was distributed to the Board. He reported that AB 2050 (Cabellero), the Small System Water System Authority Act of 2018, was on Governor Brown's desk for his signature; however, Governor Brown could potentially veto this bill. He also reported that SB 845 (Monning), the Safe and Affordable Drinking Water Fund, was not moving forward. He stated that a letter opposing SB 998 (Dodd) related to water system shutoffs was sent to Governor Brown, who would have until September 30th to sign the bill.

A discussion ensued regarding sending a copy of the letter in opposition to SB 998 to the *Ventura County Star* and *The Acorn*, or having staff write an editorial in order to inform the ratepayers of the reasons the District opposes this bill and the impacts to the District. General Manager David Pedersen stated that staff would follow-up.

C Water Supply Conditions Update

No additional update was provided.

6. TREASURER

Director Renger stated that the Treasurer's report was in order.

7. GENERAL MANAGER

A 2018 General Liability and Property Insurance Renewal

Accept the proposal from Tolman & Wiker Insurance Services, LLC, in the aggregate

amount of \$899,886, and authorize the General Manager to execute the necessary contracts and forms to purchase general liability and property insurance from Argonaut Insurance Company/Trident Public Risk Solutions for the term of October 1, 2018 through September 30, 2019.

Don Patterson, Director of Finance and Administration, presented the report.

Jeff Dodds, representing Tolman & Wiker Insurance Services, LLC, provided an overview of the general insurance market. He noted that the structure of this insurance program has been the same since 2012 with the same carriers. He addressed the increase in self-insured retention, which would increase to \$100,000 for the District's liability policies. He also addressed the District's property insurance first party coverage for covering assets, liability coverage to third parties, management liability limits, and employment practices liability limits.

Board President Peterson expressed concern that the District's risk and rates are increasing, and the Association of California Water Agencies Joint Powers Insurance Authority (ACWA/JPIA) was not asked to provide a quote.

<u>Director Caspary</u> moved to approve Item 7A. Motion seconded by <u>Director Lewitt</u>. Motion carried by the following vote:

8. FACILITIES AND OPERATIONS

A Proposed Debarment of Zusser Construction, Inc.

Authorize the General Manager to issue a Notice of Proposed Debarment to Zusser Company, Inc., in a form approved by District Counsel.

General Manager David Pedersen presented the report.

Director Caspary moved to approve Item 8A. Motion seconded by Director Renger.

A discussion ensued regarding tabling this item due to the outstanding arbitration and litigation.

<u>Director Caspary</u> moved to withdraw his motion. <u>Director Renger</u> withdrew his second to the motion. No action was taken on the item.

B Barrymore Pressure Reduction Station No. 25 Rehabilitation Project: Final Acceptance

Execute a Notice of Completion and have the same recorded; extend the contract

duration by 55 calendar days; appropriate \$100,853.31 in additional funds; and, in the absence of claims from subcontractors and others, release the retention, in the amount of \$8,377.50, within 30 calendar days after filing the Notice of Completion for the Barrymore Pressure Reducing Station Rehabilitation Project.

General Manager David Pedersen presented the report.

<u>Director Polan</u> moved to approve Item 8B. Motion seconded by <u>Director Renger</u>.

David Lippman, Director of Facilities and Operations, responded to a question regarding the delays caused by the Los Angeles County Department of Public Works in granting an encroachment permit and ways to avoid delays in the future by stating that staff worked diligently with the County to obtain the encroachment permits; however, at times they take a long time and there is no way to shorten the time period. He noted that generally the District requires the contractor to obtain the encroachment permit, and staff attempts to work with the County to streamline that process.

A discussion ensured regarding concerns that the General and Administrative (G&A) costs were three times the cost of District labor. Angela Saccareccia, Finance Manager, explained that staff conducted a thorough account analysis for total G&A and labor hours. She noted that this project contained many District labor hours and that the calculation methodology for G&A includes allocating total G&A costs across all projects by labor hours for consistency purposes. Don Patterson, Director of Finance and Administration suggested that staff could review the labor hours for this particular project and ensure that the labor hours were appropriately charged to this account.

Director Caspary suggested staff include a footnote with an explanation for this particular project, and requested that staff bring back an agenda item to discuss how G&A was allocated for this project. Don Patterson, Director of Finance and Administration, responded that staff would bring back details on the G&A for this project and a discussion regarding how G&A allocations are currently calculated.

Motion carried unanimously.

9. FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION

A GIS Software: Renewal of Small Utility Enterprise License Agreement

Authorize the General Manager to execute a three-year Small Utility Enterprise License Agreement with ESRI, Inc., at an annual cost of \$25,000 plus applicable taxes, for the District's Geographical Information System software.

General Manager David Pedersen presented the report.

<u>Director Renger</u> moved to approve Item 9A. Motion seconded by <u>Director Caspary</u>. Motion carried unanimously.

B Claim by Calabasas Medical Center c/o Majestic Asset Management

Authorize the General Manager to settle the claim by Calabasas Medical Center LLC, in the amount of \$11,451.78, upon receipt of proof of payment by the claimant.

General Manager David Pedersen presented the report.

<u>Director Caspary</u> moved to approve Item 9B. Motion seconded by <u>Director Polan</u>.

Darrell Johnson, Customer Service Manager, responded to a question regarding the useful life and inspection schedule for detector checks by stating that the facilities are inspected on a monthly basis. He noted that this detector check was in a grass area and it had extensive root intrusion, which shortened the life of the pipe spool. He also noted that staff continues to work on raising detector checks above ground.

David Lippman, Director of Facilities and Operations, responded to a question regarding inspection programs by stating that the District has tens of thousands of appurtenances in the system and that staff strives to inspect them on a regular basis. He noted that the District also has a program to rehabilitate its pressure reducing stations, and corrosion is the main cause of failures.

Motion carried unanimously.

General Manager David Pedersen presented the report.

<u>Director Renger</u> moved to approve Item 9C. Motion seconded by <u>Director Caspary</u>. Motion carried motion carried unanimously.

10. RESOURCE CONSERVATION AND PUBLIC OUTREACH

A Proposed Memorial for Hal Helsley: Review of Concept

Provide staff with feedback on the concept for a proposed memorial for Harold Helsley.

Joe McDermott, Director of Resource Conservation and Public Outreach, presented the report and a PowerPoint presentation. He suggested the Board consider commissioning an oversized bronze or wood carved acorn with a plaque giving Mr. Helsley's story, and also suggested three possible locations at the District Headquarters. He also discussed plans to plant an oak tree in front of Building No. 1 as part of the Demonstration Garden, and the possible placement of the oversized acorn and plaque under the new oak tree.

Director Renger suggested staff speak with Mr. Helsley's wife, Nancy Helsley, for her input on an appropriate memorial. He expressed support for a memorial placed at Location No. 1 at Headquarters. He also expressed concern with planting a large oak tree and whether it would survive. Mr. McDermott noted that another concern with Location No. 3 would be the timing of planting the tree with the Demonstration Project.

Director Lewitt spoke in support of having a bronze plaque with Mr. Helsley's story and planting an oak tree as opposed to commissioning a bronze acorn. He also suggested installing a bench at either Location No. 1 or 2.

Director Polan expressed interest in planting an oak tree. He also suggested meeting with artists to receive their interpretation of an acorn prior to settling on this concept.

Director Caspary expressed concern with the interpretation of an oak acorn as depicted in the PowerPoint presentation. He expressed support for planting a tree as opposed to commissioning a bronze acorn. He suggested doing something similar to the "Ann Dorgelo Water Awareness Perpetual Trophy Award" for the Annual Water Awareness Student Art Contest and potentially implementing a program to send acorns to the customers, telling Mr. Helsley's story and promoting the use of native plants.

Board President Peterson stated that Mr. Helsley's contribution to the District was the composting facility, and he suggested this might be the best location to recognize him.

Director Polan departed from the meeting at 6:10 p.m.

Mr. McDermott stated that staff would take back the Board's input and return with additional ideas and information at a future meeting.

Subject: Tapia Tertiary Filter Media Replacement: Authorization of Purchase Order

The Las Virgenes-Triunfo Joint Powers Authority (JPA) approved funding for this matter in the JPA Budget. This recommendation is before the LVMWD Board of Directors for action, as Administering Agent of the JPA, as authorized by the JPA Agreement.

SUMMARY:

One of the scheduled maintenance projects included in the adopted Fiscal Year 2018-19 JPA Budget is the replacement of media in the tertiary filters at the Tapia Water Reclamation Facility. The tertiary filters remove particulate matter in the treated water before it is disinfected. There are 12 tertiary filters at Tapia that need media replacement approximately every 10 to 15 years due to a loss of media from backwashing and a decrease in filter performance. Filter Nos. 1 and 2 are scheduled for media replacement this year. The media was last replaced in these filters in 2005. Each filter contains four feet of anthracite coal over a one-foot layer of gravel, which separates the anthracite from the underdrain. Staff recommends issuing a purchase order to ERS Industrial Services, Inc., the lowest responsive bidder for the work.

RECOMMENDATION(S):

Authorize the General Manager to issue a purchase order to ERS Industrial Services, Inc., in the amount of \$83,350.98, for tertiary filter media replacement in Filter Nos. 1 and 2 at the Tapia Water Reclamation Facility.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

Sufficient funds are available for the work in the adopted Fiscal Year 2018-19 JPA Budget. The cost of the work will be allocated 70.6% to LVMWD and 29.4% to Triunfo Sanitation District.

DISCUSSION:

A request for quotes was advertised on the District's website. Three bids were received for the work as follows:

ERS Industrial Services, Inc. \$41,675.49 per filter Carbon Activated Corp. \$50,687.50 per filter \$50,830.00 per filter

The cost of media replacement has increased significantly since 2010 when ERS Industrial Services, Inc., replaced the media in Filter Nos. 11 and 12 for \$21,111.27 each.

Authorization of Purchase Order

The Las Virgenes-Triunfo Joint Powers Authority (JPA) approved funding for this matter in the JPA Budget. This recommendation is before the LVMWD Board of Directors for action, as Administering Agent of the JPA, as authorized by the JPA Agreement.

SUMMARY:

As a part of the on-going maintenance of the Tapia Water Reclamation Facility, equipment that has reached the end of its service life is considered for replacement. The three drives for the primary scum collection system, which moves helical skimmers in the primary clarifiers, are at the end of their useful life and in need of replacement. The drives are all at least 30 years old.

In addition, staff proposes to continue the process of the converting the sludge collection drives for the secondary clarifiers to the Bibbiguard torque limiter system, which allows for the drives to automatically disengage from the motor on high torque and be easily reset. The existing sludge collection drives contain shear pins, which break on high torque and need to be manually replaced to allow for the drive to be put back in service.

Staff requested quotes from the two vendors who are authorized to provide the new scum collection drives and Bibbiguard torque limiters for the Polychem system that is installed in the clarifiers at Tapia. The Frost Company was the only firm to provide a quote, which included all of the materials and installation. Staff recommends that the replacement of the primary clarifier scum drives and the conversion of one secondary drive to the Bibbiguard system be awarded to the Frost Company.

RECOMMENDATION(S):

Authorize the General Manager to issue a purchase order to the Frost Company, in the amount of \$66,280, for the purchase and installation of three new drive units for the primary scum collection system and the conversion of a secondary sludge collection drive to the Bibbiguard system at the Tapia Water Reclamation Facility.

FISCAL IMPACT:

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

Sufficient funds are available for the work in the adopted Fiscal Year 2018-19 JPA Budget. The cost of the work will be allocated 70.6% to LVMWD and 29.4% to Triunfo Sanitation District.

DISCUSSION:

As a part of the on-going maintenance of the Tapia Water Reclamation Facility, equipment that is at the end of its useful service life is considered for replacement. The drives for the primary scum collection system, which turn helical skimmer to move scum into a trough in the primary clarifiers, are at the end of their useful life and in need of replacement. Two of the primary clarifiers at Tapia were constructed in 1970, another was built in 1979 and two more were built in 1987. The three drives for the scum collection system for these clarifiers are all at least 30 years old and in need of replacement.

The drives for the secondary clarifier sludge collection system were replaced in an earlier project. One of the features not included with these drives is the Bibbiguard torque limiter system, which allows for the drive to automatically disengage from the motor on high torque and be easily reset by pushing the shaft back into place. The existing drives contain shear pins, which break on high torque and need to be replaced for the drive to be put back into service. The shear pins can be problematic in that they may not break soon enough, causing damage to the sludge collection system. Additionally, the shear pins can be difficult to replace once they have broken. One of the five secondary drives was converted to the Bibbiguard system last year and has performed well. Staff proposes to install the Bibbiguard system on another drive this year and eventually convert the remaining three secondary clarifier drives to the Bibbiguard system.

Quotes were requested from the two local vendors who are authorized to provide the scum drives and Bibbiguard torque limiters for the Polychem collection system that is installed in all of the clarifiers at Tapia. A quotation provided by the Frost Company, in the amount of \$66,280 (\$56,780 for the scum drives and \$9,500 for conversion of the secondary drive to the Bibbiguard system). The other authorized vendor, Gierlich-Mitchell, did not submit a quotation.

Having the equipment installed by an authorized vendor is preferable to using a third-party contractor because the installation will meet the requirements of the manufacturer without the need for an authorized vendor to perform construction inspection. As a result, staff recommends award of the work to the Frost Company.

Attached for reference is a copy of the Frost Company proposal and photos of the primary

and secondary clarifier drives.

Subject: Renewal of Telecommunications Network Contract

SUMMARY:

The District utilizes Multiprotocol Label Switching (MPLS) technology for telecommunications between nine of its major facilities: Headquarters, Tapia, Rancho, Westlake, Lift Station Nos. 1 and 2, Cornell Pump Station, Stunt Road Pump Station and LV-2 Pump Station. The current service is provided through a contract with ACC Business, a division of AT&T Corporation, which is set to expire shortly. As a result, staff utilized Carrier Consultants, the District's telecommunications consultant, to solicit quotations for renewal of the MPLS service. Proposals were received from TPx Communications, Airespring and ACC Business.

Staff recommends accepting the proposal from TPx Communications as it provides the best service at the lowest overall cost. Based on a proposed five-year agreement, the District will reduce the annual cost of the service from \$69,012 to \$38,988, resulting in an annual cost-savings of \$30,024 or 43.5%. In addition, because TPx currently provides the District with its Internet and phone service, the proposal includes bundling the newly-proposed and existing services for an additional annual cost-savings of \$6,323.64. As such, the total annual cost-saving to the District under the proposed five-year agreement would be \$36,347.64 or 40%.

RECOMMENDATION(S):

Accept the proposal from TPx Communications and authorize the General Manager to execute a five-year agreement, in the annual amount of \$53,748.24 plus any applicable taxes and fees, to provide bundled telecommunication services to nine major facilities together with existing Internet and phone services.

FISCAL IMPACT:

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

The total cost of the services over the five-year contract period will be \$268,741.20, which constitutes a cost-savings of \$181,738,.20 or 40% for the term. Sufficient funds are available in the adopted Fiscal Year 2018-19 Budget and will be proposed in future fiscal year budgets for the service.

DISCUSSION:

The District's existing MPLS telecommunication network connects five SCADA locations (Lift Station Nos. 1 and 2, Cornell Pump Station, Stunt Road Pump Station and LV-2 Pump Station) along with the District's major facilities (Headquarters, Tapia Water Reclamation Facility, Rancho Las Virgenes Composting Facility, and Westlake Filtration Plant). The current service is provided through a contract with ACC Business, which is set to expire shortly. With the assistance of its telecommunications consultant, Carrier Consulting, staff solicited quotes from three companies that offer the service: TPx Communications, Airespring and ACC Business. Three proposals were received and will provide a cost-savings and increased performance to the District. Attached for reference is a summary of the key terms of the proposals as compared to the same under the District's existing contract.

Staff recommends accepting the proposal from TPx as it is the lowest cost and has the added advantage of providing a more uniform bundled solution. The District currently has a three-year contract with TPx for its Internet (100Mbps) and phone service, which can be bundled into a new five-year contract to provide additional cost-savings. Also attached is a draft of the proposed five-year agreement with TPx.

Dear Mr. Pedersen:

Thank you for your May 22, 2018 letter regarding the Water Recycling Funding Program's (WRFP) restriction on funding surface water augmentation projects, and offer to explore alternatives. We would like to clarify the statutory restrictions on funding surface water augmentation using recycled water.

The WRFP Guidelines do not place restrictions on funding surface water augmentation projects. Proposition 1 and Proposition 68 funds may be used to fund surface water augmentation projects consistent with the State Water Resources Control Board's surface water augmentation regulations. While Water Code Section 79146, enacted in 2000 as part of Proposition 13, prohibits the use of Proposition 13 funding for water recycling projects used to augment water supplies by discharging recycled water into a surface water reservoir that supplies drinking water, neither Proposition 1 nor Proposition 68 contains express direction on this issue. We have re-evaluated Proposition 1 and Proposition 68 in light of our surface water augmentation regulations and have determined that neither bond measure prohibits use for surface water augmentation projects.

WATER RECYCLING FUNDING PROGRAM: RESTRICTION ON FUNDING FOR SURFACE WATER AUGMENTATION PROJECTS

Dear Chair Marcus:

It was a pleasure to see you at the Association of California Water Agencies Spring Conference and Exhibition in Sacramento. I wanted to follow up on my note regarding Water Code Section 79146, and the unintended consequence we believe the statute imposes by prohibiting funding for surface water augmentation projects submitted under the State's Water Recycling Funding Program.

Water Code Section 79146 was enacted in 2000 as part of Proposition 13, the Safe Drinking Water, Clean Water, Watershed Protection, and Flood Protection Act. The statute prohibits the use of funding in the State's Water Recycling Subaccount for "any water recycling project used to augment water supplies by discharging recycled water into a surface water reservoir that supplies water directly to a treatment facility for a water supply system that serves domestic uses."

We believe the provision was placed in Proposition 13 because of concerns with the "yuck" factor and "toilet to tap" campaign that dominated several important political races at the time in the San Diego region. Unfortunately, the funding restriction was applied to the Recycled Water Subaccount, which was created as the time, rather than specifically to the funding authorized by Proposition 13. As a result, the statute continues to encumber newly authorized and proposed water recycling funds administered through the Recycled Water Subaccount, such as those proposed by Proposition 68.

With your Board's adoption of regulations for *Surface Water Augmentation using Recycled Water* on March 6, 2018, we believe the funding restriction imposed by Water Code Section 79146 is no longer warranted and constitutes an unnecessary impediment to implementation of surface water augmentation projects. As such, we requested the assistance of Senator Henry Stern for a potential legislative remedy, and he authored SB 1489 (copy enclosed) to address the concern with Water Code Section 79146 as it would apply to Proposition 68. However, the bill needed to be approved by the Legislature and Governor prior to the June 5, 2018 election, which proved too difficult from a timing standpoint.

When meeting with Senator Stern recently, he suggested that we reach out to you to determine if an administrative remedy may be available to address the apparent unintended consequence of this legacy statute. An act to amend Section 3214 of the Public Resources Code, relating to oil and gas. add Section 80147.5 to the Public Resources Code, relating to water, and declaring the urgency thereof, to take effect immediately.

LEGISLATIVE COUNSEL'S DIGEST

SB 1489, as amended, Stern. Oil and gas: inspection. California Drought, Water, Parks, Climate, Coastal Protection, and Outdoor Access For All Act of 2018: water recycling.

If approved by the voters at the June 5, 2018, statewide primary election as Proposition 68, the California Drought, Water, Parks, Climate, Coastal Protection, and Outdoor Access for All Act of 2018 would authorize the issuance of bonds in the amount of \$4,100,000,000 for the purpose of financing a drought, water, parks, climate, coastal protection, and outdoor access program. The proposed bond act requires \$100,000,000 to be available, upon appropriation by the Legislature, for purposes relating to water recycling and prohibits the money from being used to provide financial assistance to any water recycling project used to augment water supplies by discharging recycled water into a surface water reservoir that supplies water directly to a treatment facility for a water supply system that serves domestic uses.

This bill, operative only if Proposition 68 is approved by the voters at the June 5, 2018, statewide primary election, would add language to the provisions enacted by the proposition to eliminate this prohibition

SB 1489 <u> — 2 —</u>

on using this \$100,000,000 in bond funds for the purpose of water recycling for projects that augment surface water reservoirs that supply water directly to treatment facilities that serve domestic uses.

This bill would declare that it is to take effect immediately as an urgency statute.

Existing law requires owners or operators of oil and gas wells to keep a-careful and accurate log, core record, and history of the drilling of each well. Existing law requires the log to be kept in the local office of the owner or operator, and, together with the tour reports of the owner or operator, provides that they are subject to inspection by the State Oil and Gas Supervisor, the district deputy, or the Director of Conservation.

This bill would make nonsubstantive changes to the provision related to inspection.

The people of the State of California do enact as follows:

- This act is an urgency statute necessary for the 10 SEC. 2. immediate preservation of the public peace, health, or safety within 11 the meaning of Article IV of the California Constitution and shall 12 13 go into immediate effect. The facts constituting the necessity are:
- 14 In order for this measure to be chaptered before voters consider 15 *Proposition 68, it is necessary that this act take effect immediately.*
- SECTION 1. Section 3214 of the Public Resources Code is 16 17 amended to read:
