Subject: Public Hearing - Proposed Ordinance Amendment: Schedule of Rate Adjustments

SUMMARY:

Government Code Section 53756 allows retail water purveyors to pass along wholesale water cost increases to customers under several conditions. One of those conditions requires the adoption of a Schedule of Adjustments.

On November 24, 2009 the Board of Directors adopted Ordinance No. 11-09-259 creating a Schedule of Adjustments to Pass-Through Wholesale Cost Increases. Prior to adoption of this ordinance customers were notified by mail of the proposed Schedule of Adjustments and the District's intent to pass along future wholesale water cost increases in compliance with State law.

Metropolitan Water District of Southern California, the wholesale water supplier to the District, increased its water cost 7.5% effective January 1, 2011. This increases the cost of purchased water to the District by approximately \$800,000 per year. Passing this along to customers raises each rate tier by \$0.08 per hundred cubic feet (HCF) of water. The average customer who uses 70 HCF of water bi-monthly will see an increase in cost of \$2.82/month or 3.3%.

Considering the Board approved a planned spend down of reserves as part of its financial planning in 2007, the loss of revenue due to water allocations and the budgeted operating loss in the Water Fund of \$3 million dollars for FY 2010/11, it is recommended that the Board approve the pass through of the Metropolitan increase.

RECOMMENDATION(S):

The full reading of the proposed Ordinance amending Ordinance No. 11-86-161 (Las Virgenes Code) As it Relates to Commodity Charges for Potable Water Service be waived, and the Board order publication within 30-days of adoption using a summary of the ordinance.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

Metropolitan's wholesale water rate increase is estimated to cost the District an additional \$800,000 per year. This increase, along with the two previous increases from Metropolitan, are significantly more than the wholesale water cost projections provided by Metropolitan in 2007 and used by the District in setting water rates through FY 2011/12. Of this \$800,000 almost \$400,000 is related to the increase in Metropolitan's Readiness To Serve (RTS) charge. The RTS is a fixed charge that is paid to Metropolitan regardless of the amount of water purchased.

ORDINANCE NO. XX-XX-XXX

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF LAS VIRGENES MUNICIPAL WATER DISTRICT AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 11-86-161 (LAS VIRGENES CODE) AS IT RELATES TO COMMODITY CHARGES FOR POTABLE WATER SERVICE

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF LAS VIRGENES MUNICIPAL WATER DISTRICT as follows:

1. Purpose.

This ordinance amends the Las Virgenes Code to memorialize rate increases resulting from the pass-through increased cost of water supply.

Findings.

The board finds, determines and declares as follows:

- (a) The District has adopted a schedule of adjustments in accordance with Government Code Section 53756 to establish a schedule to pass through increases in the cost of water;
- (b) The adjustments set forth herein reflect the increased cost of water supplied to the District by the Metropolitan Water District of Southern California;
 - (c) This ordinance will not produce significant environment impacts.

3. Amendment.

Section 3-4.103 of Ordinance No. 11-86-161 is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

"3-4.103 Commodity Charges

- (a) In addition to the readiness to serve charge, each customer shall pay a commodity charge for water delivered through each meter in a bimonthly period based on the class of customer, tier allotments and the elevation zone within which the customer's property is located as follows.
- (b) A tier allotment is the number of units of water allocated to a customer for a bimonthly billing period. Tier allotments, stated in billing units, for single-family class of customers are follows:

	Single Family
Tier 1	First 16
Tier 2	Next 51
Tier 3	Next 133
Tier 4	Over 200

Tier allotments, stated in billing units, for a multi-family class of customers are as follows:

	Multi-Family
	per dwelling unit
Tier 1	First 12
Tier 2	Next 2
Tier 3	Next 10
Tier 4	Over 24

Tier allotments for commercial and irrigation classes of customers are determined by multiplying the single-family class tier allotments by the meter capacity ratio for the meter serving the property.

MINUTES REGULAR MEETING

5:00 PM September 14, 2010

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

At the request of President Caspary, the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag was given by Director Smith.

1. CALL TO ORDER AND ROLL CALL

A Call to order and roll call.

The meeting was called to order at 5:00 p.m. by President Caspary in the District offices. Assistant Deputy Secretary Conklin called the roll. Those answering present were Directors Bowman, Caspary, Renger and Smith.

Directors absent: Peterson.

2. APPROVAL OF AGENDA

A Approval of agenda.

Legal Counsel O'Neill stated subsequent to posting of the agenda a second case of potential litigation was discovered, and requires addition to 14.A Closed Session - Conference with District Counsel - Potential Litigation.

On a motion by Director Joseph Bowman, seconded by Director Lee Renger, the Board of Directors voted 5-0 to Approve by a roll call vote of Ayes: 5; Noes: 0; and Abstain: 0, the addition of a second case to 14.A Closed Session - Conference with District Counsel - Potential Litigation.

AYES: Director(s) Bowman, Caspary, Peterson, Renger, Smith

On a motion by Director Joseph Bowman, seconded by Director Lee Renger, the Board of Directors voted 5-0 to Approve the Regular Board Meeting of September 14, 2010, as amended by recommendation of Legal Counsel O'Neill.

3. PUBLIC COMMENTS

Five speaker cards were received from the public. (1) Jim Moorhead discussed termination of water service at the Smith property, which has not yet been restored; (2) Linda Stock who requested notification of whether the potential litigation cases on the agenda were related to T-Mobile or Synergy (Legal Counsel O'Neill stated that neither the one potential litigation case listed on the agenda, nor the second potential litigation case added to the agenda were for T-Mobile or Synergy); (3) Liat Samouhi requested the Board not give into any pressure that may be exerted by T-Mobile or Synergy for executing of the cell tower site agreement at Adamsville Avenue (Mulwood Tank), and stated that she has not yet received a response to her letter dated July 5, 2010, in regards to rescinding the Board action taken on June 22, 2010, and the purported Brown Act and CEQA violations; (4) Howard Rodgers spoke on behalf of Steve Kessler in regards to his water budget allocation, and made general comments regarding the proposed revisions to the adjustment and appeal process; and (5) Steve Kessler who discussed the need for some customers to have an additional appeal for their water budget allocations due to special circumstance(s).

Director Peterson arrived at 5:17 p.m. during Mr. Kessler's public comments.

4. ILLUSTRATIVE AND/OR VERBAL PRESENTATION AGENDA ITEMS

A Legislative and Regulatory Updates

Public Affairs and Communications Manager Reinhardt provided a legislative update including opposition of AB 2049 (Arambula) transfers of water; support of SB 918 (Pavely) water recycling; and stated Kathy Cole would be present at the board meeting of December 14, 2010 to provide an update of legislative activities for calendar year 2010.

B Las Virgenes Unified School District - School Programs

Director Bowman reiterated that the proposed one dollar check box on Las Virgenes bills would be considered illegal (correct per Legal Counsel O'Neill as this would be a solicitation of funds), and that for the computer advertising proposal a fair value needs to be determined (also correct per Legal Counsel O'Neill).

Public Affairs Associate Low gave a presentation entitled "LVMWD's Educational Outreach Update".

Director of Resource Conservation and Public Outreach Reyes stated that Las Virgenes USD has been asked to provide costs for computer advertising in order for staff to determine value; Las Virgenes USD has received \$115,000 in rebates; and that Las Virgenes MWD has also participated in an artificial turf program at Lupin Hill Elementary.

On a motion by Director Joseph Bowman, seconded by Director Lee Renger, the Board of Directors voted 5-0 to Approve Consent Calendar 5A-5C as presented in the recommendations.

6. TREASURER

Treasurer Smith stated that he spoke to the auditors (Diehl Evans) regarding the field work conducted the week of June 7, 2010; and stated additional field work would be conducted the week of October 4, 2010 with a report to the Board in November.

7. BOARD OF DIRECTORS

A Total Compensation Study - Expanded Scope of Work

Discuss the strategy as outlined in the Fox Lawson & Associates document entitled "Las Virgenes Municipal Water District Discussion Draft - Purpose and Philosophy", and provide the General Manager direction on the Board's interest in this matter.

General Manager Mundy discussed the expanded scope of work in the Fox Lawson & Associates Memorandum of September 1, 2010 in the amount of \$10,000; stated private sector total compensation was not part of the negotiated agreement with the represented units, but the data may be useful in the future, Fox Lawson anticipates private sector companies to disclose salary data, but doubts that they will disclose benefit data.

Director Bowman requested staff provide the Board with 4-6 reports on private vs. public sector compensation. Director Caspary asked that the reports be impartial.

On a motion by Director Lee Renger, seconded by Director Jeff Smith, the Board of Directors voted 5-0 to Approve acceptance of the terms in the expanded scope of work in an amount not to exceed \$10,000.

B Thomas Safran & Associates: Sewer Service - 4803 El Canon Avenue, Calabasas

General Manager Mundy stated just prior to the board meeting, Thomas Safran & Associates had provided the public financing information, which he has not had an opportunity to review. Director Bowman stated it needs to be well established that this is not a gift of public funds. President Caspary stated he personally invited Hal Helsley to the board meeting to provide public comments on this item, but that Mr. Helsley was not in attendance this evening.

8. FACILITIES AND OPERATIONS

A Rancho Las Virgenes Composting Facility: Biofilter Maintenance

Authorize the General Manager to approve a purchase order for Viramontes Express for biofilter media supply, removal, replacement and disposal in an amount not to exceed \$38,930.

On a motion by Director Lee Renger, seconded by Director Joseph Bowman, the Board of Directors voted 5-0 to Approve the recommendation as presented.

A Award of Bid for Water Meters

The Board of Directors authorize the General Manager to issue a one-year contract, with two one-year renewal options to Ferguson Waterworks, for the purchase and delivery of water meters. The estimated annual cost for these meters is \$394,853.10.

Director of Resource Conservation and Public Outreach Reyes stated the award of bid recommendation was being made to the lowest bidder who met the specifications; Las Virgenes does not currently use Elster meters, but they are fully compatible with the Datamatic system; and the annual cost will be based on the number of meters purchased each year with the price being set for a period of 12 months. The meters also meet the lead regulations as mentioned by President Caspary.

On a motion by Director Lee Renger, seconded by Director Glen Peterson, the Board of Directors voted 5-0 to Approve the recommendation as presented.

Director of Resource Conservation and Public Outreach Reyes stated in the past, the school district has not responded to invitations for participation in this event, however this year a qualified instructor, Ty Kastendiek of Camp David Gonzalez had expressed an interest in the Solar Cup program. Director and MWD Representative Peterson stated that if someone has an interest, Las Virgenes should sponsor the program and extend sponsorship to Camps Miller, Kirkpatrick and Gonzalez.

On a motion by Director Glen Peterson, seconded by Director Lee Renger, the Board of Directors voted 4-1 to Authorize team sponsorship in the amount of \$4,000 for Metropolitan Water District's Solar Cup educational outreach program.

Director Bowman reported on his attendance at the ACWA Federal Affairs Committee meeting of September 10, 2010, topics included WRDA bill - no allocations before the election; no budget for 2010-11 is expected; EPA released estimate of \$336 billion to repair outdated water system infrastructure; Title XVI monies \$136 million still not spent; and EPA comments are due by September 17, 2010 in regards to strategy related to Oberstar bill.

C General Manager Reports

General Manager Mundy provided an update regarding general business of the district including termination of service policy; today's fire at the entrance of Mountain View Estates; AWA Reagan Library and ACWA Fall Conference events.

D Director's Comments

Director Bowman requested an update on his request for staff to contact CASA Conference presenter Mr. Gardiner regarding customer outreach for specific issues such as the allocation process, etc. General Manager Mundy stated he had left a message for Mr. Gardiner, but had not yet received a response.

Director Bowman discussed the editorial in The Acorn regarding \$5 million cost for composting. President Caspary requested the report provided to the JPA Board on July 19, 2010 be provided again as it includes the costs for dewatering and composting.

Director Renger inquired on the co-generation project, and Director of Facilities and Operations Lippman stated the project will begin in December 2010.

Director Bowman stated that he did not see reserves on the pending list and wants to review them prior to, or at least at the same time as any future rate increases are presented; NPDES accolades - soul search on what was learned technically and the way we relate to the Regional Board staff; and stated the last Executive Officer of the Regional Board (Tracy Egosque) was excellent in regards to dealing with environmental agencies; excellent letter from staff to Koehler.

On October 8, 2010, the District received a claim from Peter Baker of Chatsworth. Mr. Baker's automobile had damages in the estimated amount of \$721 when the water main near Las Virgenes Road and Agoura Road was punctured on August 12, 2010, causing damage his vehicle.

This is similar to the claim made by Robert Ball and denied by the Board on September 14, 2010. The responsible party is the contractor who was installing an electrical conduit for the City of Calabasas. The contractor installing the conduit was Terno Electric, headquartered in La Mirada, CA. The District is also filing a claim against the contractor for cost of repair and cost of water loss.

Staff has discussed the contractor's liability with Mr. Baker.

District Counsel concurs with the recommendation.





SUMMARY:

On August 24, 2010 the Board of Directors approved negotiation of a conditional payment agreement for connection fees with Thomas Safran & Associates. The attached agreement has been prepared consistent with the Board's motion and is being presented herein for consideration and approval.

RECOMMENDATION(S):

Approve the agreement regarding potable water capacity fees and sewer connection fees between Las Virgenes Municipal Water District and Canyon Creek Seniors, LP.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

Current capacity fees for a 75 unit project amount to \$525,000 for Sanitation, \$78,933 for a 3" domestic meter and \$12,333 for a 1" irrigation meter. If approved the agreement will set the capacity fees for Sanitation at \$36,750, the 3" meter at \$5,525.31 and the 1" meter at \$863.31. Administrate fees, equipment and installation costs are in addition to the capacity fees and will be paid by the developer at full cost.

DISCUSSION:

In August of 2010 Thomas Safran & Associates approached the District with a request to lower the capacity fees to their project located at 4803 El Canon Ave, Calabasas, CA. The project currently under construction is a 75 unit low income affordable senior housing project within the City of Calabasas. Ninety three percent (93%) of the project is being funded by federal, state and local public money or tax credits. The Las Virgenes Administrative Code allows the waiver of capacity fees from public entities and is normally handled through an administrate process. However, because this project is being constructed by a private entity with the majority of funding from public money any reduction in capacity fees must be granted by the Board.

On August 24, 2010 the Board approved negotiation of a conditional payment agreement for connections fees with Thomas Safran & Associates. Due to funding conditions placed on the developer it is necessary to approve the agreement before November 16, 2010.

The major elements of the agreement include recording a land use restriction agreement against the property for 30 years, requires full fees to be paid anytime the project no longer retains its low income status and requires successors and assigns to be responsible for the conditions of the agreement.

AGREEMENT REGARDING POTABLE WATER CAPACITY FEES AND SEWER CONNECTION FEES BETWEEN LAS VIRGENES MUNICIPAL WATER DISTRICT AND CANYON CREEK SENIORS, LP

As of November 9, 2010, **Las Virgenes Municipal Water District**, herein "District," and **Canyon Creek Seniors**, **LP**, herein "Developer," agree as follows:

Section 1. Purpose.

District is a municipal water district formed and operating pursuant to California Water Code § 71000 *et seq.* Developer is developing a 75-unit senior low income affordable housing project designed to provide housing for fixed income seniors in Calabasas, California ("Project"). The Project is located at 4803 El Canon Avenue, in Calabasas, California, which is within the District's service area. The District currently maintains facilities to provide water and sewer service to the Project. Financing for the Project is being provided by several public sources: the City of Calabasas; the County of Los Angeles, the State of California and federal tax credits. This public funding accounts for 93% of the Project cost.

District imposes potable water capacity fees and sewer connection fees on new development in its service area to help defray the cost of capital improvements needed to serve new developments. The funding for the Project cannot support the level of potable water capacity fees and sewer connection fees normally imposed by the District on a project of this size. District is authorized to reduce these fees per Sections 3-2.206(e), 3-2.208(g) and 5-2.207(d) of the Las Virgenes Municipal Water District Administrative Code. By way of this agreement, the parties intend that District will reduce its potable water capacity fees and sewer connection fees commensurate with the amount of public investment in the Project, in consideration for Developer agreeing to extend the affordability of the Project to a 30 year term.

Section 2. Description of Property.

The Developer's property is located at 4803 El Canon Avenue in Calabasas, California, and is more particularly described in the Legal Description attached as **Attachment A**.

Section 3. Agreement.

In consideration of District's agreement to reduce its potable water capacity fees and sewer connection fees for the Project, Developer agrees to include one hundred percent (100%) of the housing units in a land use restriction agreement ("LURA") for a period of 30 years, beginning November 10, 2010. The LURA shall be recorded against the Project with the Los Angeles County Recorder's Office. In exchange, Developer will pay the reduced fees to District as described in **Attachment B**.

Developer also agrees to purchase and install a three-inch meter and a detector check for fire protection as part of Project construction, and to pay expenses for plan check, inspection, and easement processing.

At anytime in the future, should the project lose it low income affordability status, the property owner will be responsible to pay the District 100% of the then current potable water capacity fees and sewer connection fees. Failure to pay these fees will result in termination of water and sanitation service to the property.

All of the terms, covenants and conditions of this agreement shall be binding upon the Developer and the successors and assigns of the Developer.

Las Virgenes-Triunfo Joint Powers Authority approved funding for this matter in the Joint Powers Authority Budget. This recommendation is before the LVMWD Board of Directors for action, as administering agent, as authorized under the Joint Powers Authority Agreement.

SUMMARY:

On October 27, 2009, the Board awarded a contract to Blois Construction, Inc. (Blois) to construct 8,966 feet of the 24" Recycled Water (REW) Pipeline from Tapia State Park to Mulholland Highway. This project was constructed to provide additional capacity, redundancy, reliability, and operation flexibility in the recycled water transmission system. Six change orders were approved during the construction. As of October 29, 2010, the project was completed. It is appropriate at this time to file the Notice of Completion, make the final payment and release retention as stipulated in the contract.

RECOMMENDATION(S):

Approve the execution of a Notice of Completion by the Secretary of the Board for and on behalf of the District and have the same recorded; and that in the absence of claims from subcontractors and others, release retention in the amount of \$350,239.18 thirty calendar days after filing the Notice of Completion for the 24" Recycled Water (REW) Pipeline from Tapia State Park to Mulholland Highway.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

SUMMARY:

On November 10, 2009, the Board awarded a contract to Crosno Construction, Inc. in the amount of \$885,755.06 for significant repairs and upgrades at Kimberly and Mulwood tanks and with a completion date of July 13, 2010. The scope included internal coating repairs, partial (spot) exterior repairs (with the option of a full repair if necessary), mechanical and piping improvements, roadway repairs, and security system upgrades. Minor repairs of the roadways around Woolsey and Indian Hills tank were also included. The existing cathodic protection (CP) systems at both tanks were inspected and refurbished.

A total of one (1) Change Order was administratively approved for a total net credit of \$65,502.69. Change Order 1 consists of following four items:

1) A credit of \$71, 890 for exterior coating that was found in good conditions and did not need to be fully repaired. 2) An increase of \$21,260 for additional 1,063 linear feet of asphalt dike at bid price of \$20 per linear foot. 3) An increase of \$4,391.31 for the increased length and height of a retaining wall due to field conditions. 4) A credit of \$19,264.00 for miscellaneous structural repairs that were found in good condition.

A additional 108 day time extension was included in Change Order 1. to account for various delays due to site and weather conditions and sub-contractor changes.

As of October 29, 2010, the project was completed and both tanks are back in service. It is appropriate at this time to file the Notice of Completion, make the final payment and release retention as stipulated in the contract.

RECOMMENDATION(S):

Approve the execution of a Notice of Completion by the Secretary of the Board for and on behalf of the District and have the same recorded; approve the final Progress Payment, in the amount of \$37,531.51 to Crosno Construction, Inc., and that in the absence of claims from subcontractors and others, release retention in the amount of \$82,025.24 thirty calendar days after filing the Notice of Completion for Kimberly and Mulwood Tanks Renovation Project.

SUMMARY:

On September 28, 2010, the Board of Directors approved a Call for Bids for outsourcing the weekly mailing process of customer bills. Bids were received and opened publicly on Monday, October 18, 2010.

RECOMMENDATION(S):

The Board of Directors authorize the General Manager to issue a one year contract with two one-year renewal options to V3 Corporation for the outsourcing of the weekly process of mailing customer bills. Proposed price is for an estimated average quantity of 3,000 pieces of mail per week at \$0.447 per piece processed. The estimated annual cost to the District for this service is \$60,000.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

Funds are available in the current budget and will be proposed in future budget for the outsourcing of this service.

DISCUSSION:

Bids were sent to nine service providers and only one response was received as follows:

V3 Corporation: \$0.447 per piece

V3 Corporation is the current service provider and the only responsive bidder meeting the District specifications and requirements. The proposed price per piece is the average price per piece for postage and handling different kinds of customer mailings. The price is the same as the last three years. Staff has reviewed the required documentation and recommends this contract be awarded to V3 Corporation for the outsourcing of the weekly customer bills mailing process.

Subject: Landscape Maintenance Services

SUMMARY:

Villa Esperanza Services (VES) is a non-profit organization that provides programs to give the developmentally disabled a chance to learn and work as productive members of the community. Other services they provide include janitorial, beach maintenance, moving, vending and food preparation services. Notable employers include the major supermarket chains, Home Depot, Mann Theaters, PetSmart, etc. Work crews always work under full supervision.

For the past 6 years, VES has provided landscape maintenance at the District facilities. They have maintained the facilities at a level that exceeds staff's expectations as demonstrated by the appearance of the grounds at the District HQ, Tapia, Rancho and the Filtration Plant. Their cost has remained at \$4,555 per month but because of rising prices, they are requesting a 5% increase of \$228 per month. In the past 2 years, their work was paid on a month-to-month basis. To plan their program better, VES seeks to have a longer term commitment for their services. Staff, therefore, recommends a one-year contract at \$57,396 with two one-year renewal options. The Agreement is attached.

To consolidate all routine landscape maintenance work, staff has also negotiated inclusion of Equestrian Tank into this contract. This service is currently provided by a different company at a cost of \$350 per month. Overall, the District will reduce its total landscape maintenance cost at slightly below the current level.

RECOMMENDATION(S):

Authorize the General Manager to enter into a one-year agreement, with two (2) one-year renewal options, with Villa Esperanza Services to provide landscape maintenance services in an amount not to exceed \$4,783 per month.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

Services will be charged to the appropriate business unit for each facility.

All of the terms and provisions of this Agreement shall be binding upon each of the parties hereto, and upon the successors and assigns of the District, and the executors, administrators, successors and assigns of the Company. Exhibit A - SCOPE OF WORK FOR LANDSCAPE MAINTENANCE SERVICES

A. Work Crews

Work crews will consist of four (4) highly-trained Villa Esperanza Services (VES) clients with a minimum of 6 months experience in landscape maintenance.

One (1) VES landscape supervisor (Job Coach) trained in CPR and First Aid, and knowledgeable and experienced in the field of Landscape Maintenance will assist and supervise the crew at all times when on site.

Work hours will be from Monday through Friday between the hours of 8:00 AM and 2:00 PM, with a one-half hour lunch break during the work day. The total net crew work hours shall equal 27.5 work hours per week.

B. Facilities

Work areas include:

Las Virgenes Municipal Water District Headquarters Campus Tapia Water Reclamation Facility Rancho Las Virgenes Composting Facility Westlake Filtration Plant Equestrian Tank

C. Activities

Work shall include the following tasks:

- Clean trash, debris, leaves, etc. from walks and drives
- Clean stains from walls and pavement
- □ Maintain drainage (v-ditches, curbs and gutters, etc.)
- Turf maintenance:
 - Mowing weekly with a mulching mower, unless directed otherwise
 - Dethatching, aerating and top dressing (utilizing compost from the Rancho Las Virgenes Composting Facility) on an asneeded basis as determined by the District, but not to exceed twice annually.
- □ Trim groundcover and shrubs (only as directed)
- □ Arbor care under 12 feet (only as directed)
- Fertilizing (only as directed)
- Ongoing weed control (using District-approved methods)
- Irrigation system inspections and repairs (as directed)

Landscape Maintenance Services

 Other tasks as requested by the District, such as removal of landscape plantings or installation of new plant materials (within work ability and safety guidelines)

VES shall provide a weekly schedule based on the District's priorities and seasonal requirements for certain tasks.

D. Liability

VES shall pay Workers Compensation, Unemployment Insurance, and FICA to all employees. VES shall carry its own liability policy and is responsible for its job coaches and all other VES staff members involved with the training and support of its crews.

VES shall provide comprehensive general liability insurance in the amount of one million dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence and two million dollars (\$2,000,000) aggregate. A Special Endorsement naming the District, its elected, appointed boards, officers, agents, and employees, as additional insured shall be provided on a form approved by District Counsel.

Automobile liability in the amount of one million (\$1,000,000) combined single limits per claim and aggregate for hired vehicles and non-owned vehicles.

VES shall obtain and maintain, during the life of this agreement, Worker's Compensation Insurance in the statutory amount.

E. Prevailing Wage

VES client-employees shall be paid sub-minimum wages based on productivity time studies performed bi-annually. The Department of Labor grants sub-minimum wage waivers to Community Rehabilitation Programs who provide Supported Employment Programs that service the disabled population.

VES staff employees shall be paid wages commensurate with other Community Rehabilitation Program staff engaged in similar programs and contract services.

F. Billing

VES shall submit invoices for contract services at the end of each month. Payment shall in accordance with District payment schedule.

G. Guarantee

VES guarantees all work to be performed in a workman-like, professional manner.

H. Contract Provisions

Either party may terminate the agreement for services without cause with a 30-day written notice.

Subject: National Geographic - Water for Tomorrow

SUMMARY:

At the last meeting, the Board deferred the renewal of the subscription to *Water for Tomorrow* and directed staff to provide feedback to ACWA by member agencies and the readers. The attached material from ACWA provides magazine distribution in California, member agency survey results and feedback from readers.

Sixty five percent of agencies who responded to the survey indicated that they will renew their subscription at the current level. The different magazine sections also ranked high in the same survey. There were very few responses to the ACWA online reader poll but those who did highly rated the magazine.

RECOMMENDATION(S):

Provide direction to staff as to the Board's preference on continuing to subscribe to *Water for Tomorrow* for another four issues to be distributed to customers (two times each year, one in the spring, the other in autumn) in 2011 and 2012.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

Cost for distributing the publication is approximately \$13,000 per issue for a total commitment of \$52,000 spread across two fiscal years. For planning purposes, ACWA will only accept a commitment for all four issues. The FY 2010-11 budget contains funding for distributing two issues; one under the old (existing) agreement. If the Board authorizes continuation of *Water forTomorrow*, the total commitment of new funds would be \$39,000; \$26,000 to be budgeted for FY 2011-12 and \$13,000 for FY 2012-13. (Account number 101900.6604)

DISCUSSION:

In the National Geographic tradition, *Water for Tomorrow* is a high-quality publication with excellent graphics and well-researched story material that primarily focuses on California water issues. The District has received several favorable customer comments on the publication and only one unfavorable comment which arose from the content of a particular story. This year, LVMWD has representation on the ACWA Communications Committee and the *Water for Tomorrow* subcommittee, enabling our agency to provide direct input on content.





Subject: Resolution of Intent for Continuation of Potable Water Standby Charge

SUMMARY:

Las Virgenes Municipal Water District desires to continue its Potable Water Replacement Program. Prior to FY 95-96, this program was funded entirely through the potable water rate structure from the Potable Water Replacement Fund. In June 1995, the District implemented a "Standby Charge" Program, pursuant to the 'Municipal Water District Law' (Water Code Section 71630 et seq) that would augment the Potable Water Replacement Fund with a steady source of alternate income. As the Replacement Fund Program benefits both existing and future customers, the Standby Charge is assessed on both improved and vacant properties insuring the capability and reliability to both existing customers now and future customers when service is needed. The program has been renewed each year since FY 95-96. Staff recommends that this program be continued for FY 11-12. The Standby Charge for FY 11-12 year will continue to be ten dollars (\$10) per parcel per year for parcels one acre and under and ten dollars (\$10) per acre and portion thereof per year for parcels greater than one acre. In FY 09-10, the District received \$505,000 in Standby Charge revenue for the Potable Water Replacement Fund.

Attached for Board approval and adoption is the Resolution of Intent (ROI) to continue the Potable Water Standby Charge.

Datastream Business Solutions, Inc. (formerly Reiter Lowry Consultants) will assist the District, as they have since the inception of the program, in administering the program by maintaining the tax database which is submitted to the County for the tax assessment, conducting necessary mailings and other program support. Staff recommends approval of the consulting agreement contract with Datastream Business Solutions, Inc. (attached) for a two-year period at an annual cost not to exceed \$20,500 (excluding postage).

RECOMMENDATION(S):

Approve the Letter Agreement for Professional Services with Datastream Business Solutions, Inc. for assistance on the Standby Charge Program, at an amount not to exceed \$20,500 per year (excluding postage) for a two year period; adopt the proposed Resolution of Intent (Resolution No. 11-10-2409) continuing the Standby Charge pursuant to the "Municipal Water District Law" with property owner notification pursuant to California Water Code, Section 71638.3; and Set a Public Hearing for 5:00 PM, January 11, 2011 to consider the continuation of the Standby Charge.

RESOLUTION NO. 11-10-2409: A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF LAS VIRGENES MUNICIPAL WATER DISTRICT INITIATING PROCEEDINGS FOR THE CONTINUATION OF THE WATER AVAILABILITY OR STANDBY CHARGE FOR THE FISCAL YEAR COMMENCING JULY 1, 2011.

(Reference is hereby made to Resolution No. 11-10-2409 on file in the District's Resolution Book and by this reference the same is incorporated herein and made a part of hereof.)

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

Funds to cover the costs related to administration of the Potable Water Standby Charge Program

(consultant fees, staff labor, etc.) are included in the annual budget for FY 11-12 adopted by the Board (page A-3).

DISCUSSION:

For the first three years of the Standby Charge Program the District notified **ALL** landowners within the District, by postcard, pursuant to California Water Code, Article 2, Section 71632, of the public hearing to initiate or continue the water standby charge. In conjunction with this mass mailing, a notice of the time, place and purpose of the public hearing, was published in a newspaper of general circulation, once a week for a two week period, pursuant to Section 6066 of the Government Code. As this procedure was used for three consecutive years, the water code allows an alternative procedure (commencing Section 71638) for property owner notification. According to Section 71638.3 "*The secretary shall cause written notice to be mailed to the owner of any affected property which changed ownership since the last standby assessment or availability was fixed..."*. This alternative was used for the FY 98-99 through FY 10-11 Standby Charge notification and is recommended for the FY 11-12 notification. In addition, a publication of the Notice of Public hearing will again be made, pursuant to Government Code Section 6066, in a newspaper of general circulation, once a week for a two week period.

A 'Deferral Program' is available for property owners that receive little or no District benefit. This deferral, once executed, remains in effect until 1) the property owner receives benefit in whatever form, 2) the Standby Charge Program is discontinued, or 3) the landowner terminates the deferral in writing and pays, to the District, the deferred charges due, up to a ten year maximum. Over the last 16 years 189 parcels less than one acre (\$1,890 in deferrals) and 493 parcels greater than one acre (\$105,230.94 in deferrals) have been deferred.

The Standby Charge program needs to be continued in order to guarantee a steady second source of income that will supplement the Potable Water Replacement Fund and to provide an equitable means of assessing existing and future customers for a portion of costs for replacing the potable water system.

Dear Mike:

DBSI understands that Las Virgenes is again planning an early hearing to allow adequate time for property owners to exercise the exemption/deferral process. Since the District has completed five years under the Municipal Water District Act, they may elect to use the alternative provisions as long as the rate remains the same. The following schedule is submitted for the coming year for your review and edit.

Adopt Resolution of Intention November 2010

Mail Notice (Alternate provisions) November 2010

Conduct Hearing & Adopt Charges January 2011

Process Applications January 2011 – July 15, 2011

Submit Charges August 10, 2011

Several assumptions were used in preparing the schedule. The first assumption is that the current year rate (\$10/acre \$10/parcel) will remain the same. The second assumption is that the District will levy the charge based on the alternate provisions of the Municipal Water District Code sections. Third, the District will use the 21-day notice provision for mailing to property owners.

DBSI's proposed scope of work for the FY 11/12 and FY 12/13 programs is based on the above and includes the following tasks:

- Public Notification (using the Alternative Procedures Act, only change of ownership and new APNs require mailed notice)
- Provide Public Hearing support
- Permanent compact disc record of preliminary and final charges

- Submit CDs containing charges to County and reconcile with County Auditor
- Respond to taxpayers' telephone inquiries
- Administration of requests for deferral/exemption/technical correction

PROPOSED SERVICES

While there are continued debates about Proposition 218's provisions, existing standby charges (now referred to as assessments) can be renewed as long as the criteria are met and the rules followed. Following adoption of the Resolution of Intention by the Board of Directors, DBSI will prepare mailing data and coordinate with its sub-contractor for the proper notification of parcels within LVMWD (mailing only to new parcels and ownership changes). DBSI will continue to assist with telephone inquiries from property owners.

DBSI will coordinate with the Auditor Controller of Los Angeles County for submission of FY 11/12 and FY 12/13 standby charges. DBSI will ensure the highest order of accuracy and provide ongoing liaison with the County. Following reconciliation of charges to the closed tax roll, DBSI will prepare an archive copy of FY 11/12 and FY 12/13 charges on compact disc.

The proposed budget covers the next twenty-four months of standby charge administration services, commencing October 1, 2010 and ending September 30, 2012. While DBSI anticipates actual expenses will be below this budget, the cost of printing, mailing, compact disc, etc. may go up during the next 24 months.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF LAS VIRGENES MUNICIPAL WATER DISTRICT as follows:

Section 1. **Purpose and Scope**

This resolution initiates proceedings to continue to levy a water standby charge for the fiscal year commencing July 1, 2011, to finance water replacement programs of the district.

Section 2. Affected Lands

Lands within the Las Virgenes Municipal Water District service boundaries are affected by this resolution.

Section 3. **Proposed Charge**

- (a) The proposed standby charge shall not exceed \$10.00 per acre per year or \$10.00 per parcel of less than one acre per year for each parcel of affected land.
- (b) It is also proposed that variance to the above charges be granted for unusual circumstances.

Section 4. Public Hearing

- (a) The board shall conduct a public hearing at Las Virgenes Municipal Water District, 4232 Las Virgenes Road, Calabasas, California, on January 11, 2011, at the hour of 5:00 o'clock p.m., or as soon thereafter as the matter can be heard, to consider the continuation of the standby charges described herein. The board will hear and consider all objections or protests, if any, to the proposed charges.
- (b) The notice of hearing shall be in the form required by law. The notice shall be mailed at least twenty-one days prior to the date set for hearing to each owner of land for which ownership has changed since the last standby assessment or availability charge was fixed as shown on the last equalized assessment roll, or known to the secretary of the district. The notice shall also be published at least once a week for two weeks prior to the date set for the hearing in a newspaper of general circulation printed and published within the district, if there is one, and if not, then in a newspaper of general circulation printed and published in Los Angeles County.

Notice of Public Hearing Las Virgenes Municipal Water District Standby Charge

Las Virgenes Municipal Water District, to continue its record of reliability in providing quality water service, proposes to continue to levy a standby charge to replace its potable water system.

The system now consists of more than 394 miles of water line, 24 storage tanks, 24 pump stations, Las Virgenes Reservoir and Westlake Filtration Plant. Las Virgenes' prompt restoration of water service to its customers following the January 1994 earthquake demonstrates the importance and inherent vulnerability of water delivery systems.

Standby charge revenue is used to assure the existing Las Virgenes water system continues to be sound, safe, and reliable. To accomplish this, the district proposes to continue its annual fee of \$10 per parcel (one acre or less) and \$10 per acre (over one acre), to replace pipes, equipment and other elements of the water system.

For a typical family, this will amount to less than 85 cents per month. If adopted, the charge will continue to be collected as part of annual property tax bills. Certain properties may qualify for deferral under the general headings of zoning, land use, and dedicated open space. To be considered for the 2011-2012 fiscal year, deferral requests must be submitted on forms available from the district no later than April 15, 2011. If your property has been previously granted a deferral by the district, no further action is necessary.

At its regular meeting beginning at 5:00 PM on January 11, 2011, the Board of Directors of the Las Virgenes Municipal Water District, 4232 Las VIrgenes Road, Calabasas, CA 91302, the district will hold a public hearing to inform property owners and provide the opportunity to comment on or object to the proposal. Written remarks may be submitted to the address below, not later than 5:00 PM on January 11, 2011. All communications must identify the property owner and contain sufficient description to identify their lands. Copies of the resolution and the schedule of charges are available for review at the district office.

Following the public hearing, the Board of Directors of the district will vote on the proposed standby charge at its regular meetings on January 11 and 25, 2011.
