Some good news is the state began the new "water year" with an early projection of 25 percent of normal deliveries, up from just 5 percent at this time last year. As our water is imported from northern California, the amount of rain and snow that falls in the Sierras through the end of March will determine the final amount to be delivered through the State Water Project.

## Globe Mallows

These native chaparral plants are often overlooked in our landscapes. They are a striking addition to areas with good drainage, such as slopes, and their variety of blossom colors add color to your garden at otherwise drab times of the year.



A California native, this medium shrub is well branched with semideciduous hairy leaves. Pink blossoms resemble hollyhocks and appear from spring to summer. 3-12' h x 6' w

Mesa or Chaparral Mallow<sup>32</sup>



Apricot or Desert Mallow<sup>1</sup>




An extremely hardy native, this small shrub bears bright apricot to coral 1" blossoms summer through fall with gray-green leaves; does not like to be wet in the winter. Does well with periodic trimming. 3' h x 3' w

Sphaeralcea ambigua

White-coat Globe Mallow<sup>1</sup>

Sphaeralcea munroana Munros Mallow<sup>14</sup>

This native groundcover forms a low mounded shrub. Spring through summer the dark pink orange blossoms cover the foliage. Grows quickly with regular irrigation. 1'h x 3-5'w





Malacothamnus fremontii

This native is often available in commercial nurseries. All stem and leaf parts are covered with white hairs; the pink, tulipshaped blossoms appear from spring to fall. 2-6+'h x 3'w
