July 30, 2011

The Board of Directors of Las Virgenes Municipal Water District met in Special Meeting at 32601 Torchwood Place, in Westlake Village, California, at 9:00 AM on Saturday, July 30, 2011.

President Renger called the meeting to order at 9:10 AM.

President Renger called the roll. Those answering present were Directors Bowman, Caspary, Renger and Steinhardt. The Chair declared a quorum present.

Absent: Director Peterson.

2 1235' Backbone Tank Site Workshop: General Manager Mundy welcomed the public and introduced the Board, Mayor Ned Davis, Councilmember Philippa Klessig and City Engineer John Knipe from the City of Westlake Village.

General Manager Mundy provided an overview of presentations to be made during the workshop, spoke about why we were here today, order of today's program, the availability of tours of both tank sites, and general logistics of transportation for the public during and after the meeting.

General Manager Mundy introduced staff and experts who will be presenting and other experts who are available to answer questions. They included David Lippman, PE, Director of Facilities and Operations for Las Virgenes Municipal Water District; Gordon Revey, PE, blasting expert; Eric Magee, PE representing DYK Incorporated; Glen Hille, PE representing AECOM, who was the construction manager for the Westlake Filtration Plant project; Stan Kline, GE, representing AECOM, who is an expert on dam construction; and Tom Blake CEG, PE, representing Fugro West, an Engineering Geologist and Geotechnical Engineer, who provided the District an analysis of excavation alternatives.

Mr. Lippman began the presentations with an overview of the water system backbone improvements program, and discussed the reasons why improvements are needed and the need for additional water storage.

Gordon Revey provided an overview of the blasting required to construct a tank at the Las Virgenes Reservoir and the safety measures to be employed to minimize impact to the public.

Eric Magee presented an overview of pre-stressed tank construction, including the equipment required and delivery of cement for the tank.

At the end of the presentations, members of the public were afforded the opportunity to present written questions to staff and the experts. General Manager Mundy facilitated the question and answer period wherein staff and experts responded to approximately 50 questions.

3 Upon conclusion of the question and answer period the Chair declared the meeting adjourned at 11:15 a.m. The public was then offered tours of the two proposed tanks sites at the reservoir.

August 23, 2011

The Board of Directors of Las Virgenes Municipal Water District met in Special Meeting at 4232 Las Virgenes Road, in Calabasas, California, at 4:00 PM on Tuesday, August 23, 2011.

President Renger called the meeting to order at 4:00 PM.

The Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag was given by President Renger.

Assistant Deputy Secretary Conklin called the roll. Those answering present were Directors Bowman, Caspary, and Renger. The Chair declared a quorum present.

Absent: Directors Peterson and Steinhardt.

2 Financial Planning Workshop: General Manager Mundy introduced Sanjay Gaur, Manager; Raftelis Financial Consultants.

Mr. Gaur provided a presentation entitled "Water and Wastewater Rate Study", dated August 23, 2011, discussing Conservation Rate Structures (water budget and inclining tiers); Options for Residential Wastewater Rates; Goals and Objective of the Study; and Project Schedule Options.

Director Steinhardt arrived at 4:26 p.m.

Board of Director comments included fundamental goal of study is to meet 20×2020 ; obligation to educate customers about 20×2020 ; show customers how to reduce usage; existing usage history; we need to reward past conservation; the prior plan worked, but could have been better as it related to higher water users; higher water users need to reduce, but not 75-80%; we still need revenue to cover costs; those who did not conserve have to; efficient water usage is important; customer education is vital; (Director Peterson arrived at 4:58 p.m.) we need to look at efficiency of lots; customer understanding is # 1, if there is no buyin there are problems; when refunds were issued, those who conserved felt slighted and may not opt to conserve the next time around.

A conceptual vote was called for at which time additional comments were made in regards to use of historical data could be a pitfall; there is a need for additional time to consider the options; the district loses money on Tier 1 rates; another comment was Tier 1 rates should not be affected due to the low level of water usage; likes budgets, but budgets for properties with large lots need more work; revenue neutral as some tiers will always gain or lose.

Direction from the Board was for staff to work with Raftelis on a rate program based on water budgets.

3 The Chair declared the Special Meeting - Financial Planning Workshop adjourned at 5:11 p.m. at which time the Regular Meeting convened.

On August 10, 2010, the Board of Directors approved with conditions the recommendation for "staff to issue a letter to LAFCO informing them that LVMWD has no objection to the detachment of Parcel Map 71073 in accordance with LAFCO File: Reorganization No. 2010-04 to Los Angeles County Waterworks District No. 29" with a provision to continue negotiations for a temporary water wheeling agreement between the property owner, District No. 29 and Las Virgenes through the Local Agency Formation Commission (LAFCO).

Since that time the detachment worked its way through LAFCO and County Board of Supervisors for final approval. On August 30, 2011 the General Manager received a letter from the County of Los Angeles, Department of Public Works, requesting the District approve the attached resolution. The resolution authorizes the transfer of ad valorem tax revenues from LVMWD to County Water Works District 29 as a result of the detachment.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 99.01 of the Revenue and Taxation Code, in the case of any jurisdictional change that will result in a special district providing one or more services to an area where those services have not previously been provided by any local agency, the special district and each local agency that receives an apportionment of property tax revenue from the area may negotiate an exchange of property tax revenue generated in the area subject to the jurisdictional change and attributable to those local agencies; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of the County of Los Angeles, acting on behalf of Los Angeles County Waterworks District No. 29, Malibu; County of Los Angeles Public Library; County of Los Angeles Road District No. 3; Consolidated Fire Protection District of Los Angeles County; and County of Los Angeles Flood Control District; together with the Board of Directors of the Las Virgenes Municipal Water District, the Board of Trustees of the Los Angeles County West Vector Control District, and the Board of Directors of the Resource Conservation District of the Santa Monica Mountains, have determined that the amount of property tax revenue to be exchanged between their respective agencies as a result of the annexation proposal identified as Annexation 29-2 to Los Angeles County Waterworks District No. 29, Malibu, as a part of Local Agency Formation Commission Reorganization 2010-04, is as set forth:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED as follows:

- 1. The Los Angeles County Waterworks District No. 29, Malibu; County of Los Angeles Public Library; County of Los Angeles Road District No. 3; Consolidated Fire Protection District of Los Angeles County; County of Los Angeles Flood Control District; Las Virgenes Municipal Water District, Los Angeles County West Vector Control District; and Resource Conservation District of the Santa Monica Mountains have determined that the amount of property tax revenue to be exchanged between their respective agencies as a result of the annexation proposal identified as Annexation 29-2 is approved and accepted.
- 2. For fiscal years commencing on or after July 1, 2012, or the July 1 after the effective date of this jurisdictional change, whichever is later, the property tax revenue increment generated from the area within Annexation 29-2 shall be allocated to the affected agencies as indicated in the enclosed worksheets (Exhibits A, B, C, and D).
- 3. No transfer of property tax revenues other than those specified in Paragraph 2 shall be made as a result of Annexation 29-2.
- 4. If at any time after the effective date of this Joint Resolution the calculations used herein to determine initial property tax transfers or the data used to perform those calculations are found to be incorrect, thus producing an improper or inaccurate property tax transfer, the property tax transfer shall be recalculated, the corrected transfer shall be implemented for the next fiscal year, and any amounts of property tax received in excess of that which is proper shall be refunded to the appropriate agency.

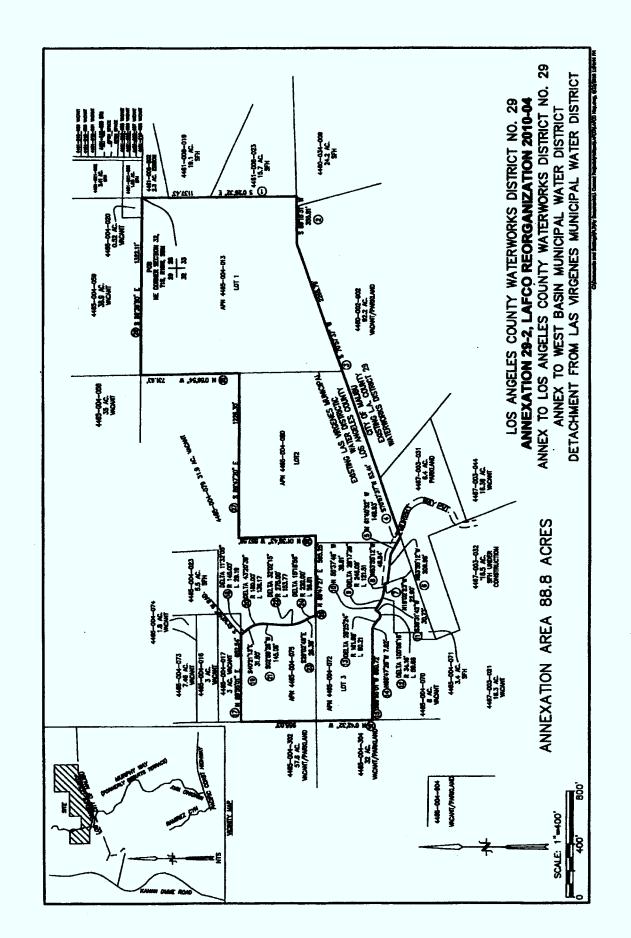

SUMMARY:

The Local Agency Formation Committee of Los Angeles County (LAFCO) has requested comments for the proposed detachment of Parcel Map 71073 from LVMWD and annexation to Los Angeles County Waterworks District No. 29. This is an area of 88 acres located adjacent to the southerly boundary of Las Virgenes Municipal Water District approximately 3,000 feet east of Kanan Road. The nearest LVMWD water line is approximately 4,000 feet northeasterly (across open land) from the 3 building sites on this parcel map (see attached map).

RECOMMENDATION(S):

Direct staff to issue a letter to LAFCO informing them that LVMWD has no objection to the detachment of Parcel Map 71073 in accordance with LAFCO File: Reorganization No. 2010-04 to Los Angeles County Waterworks District No. 29.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

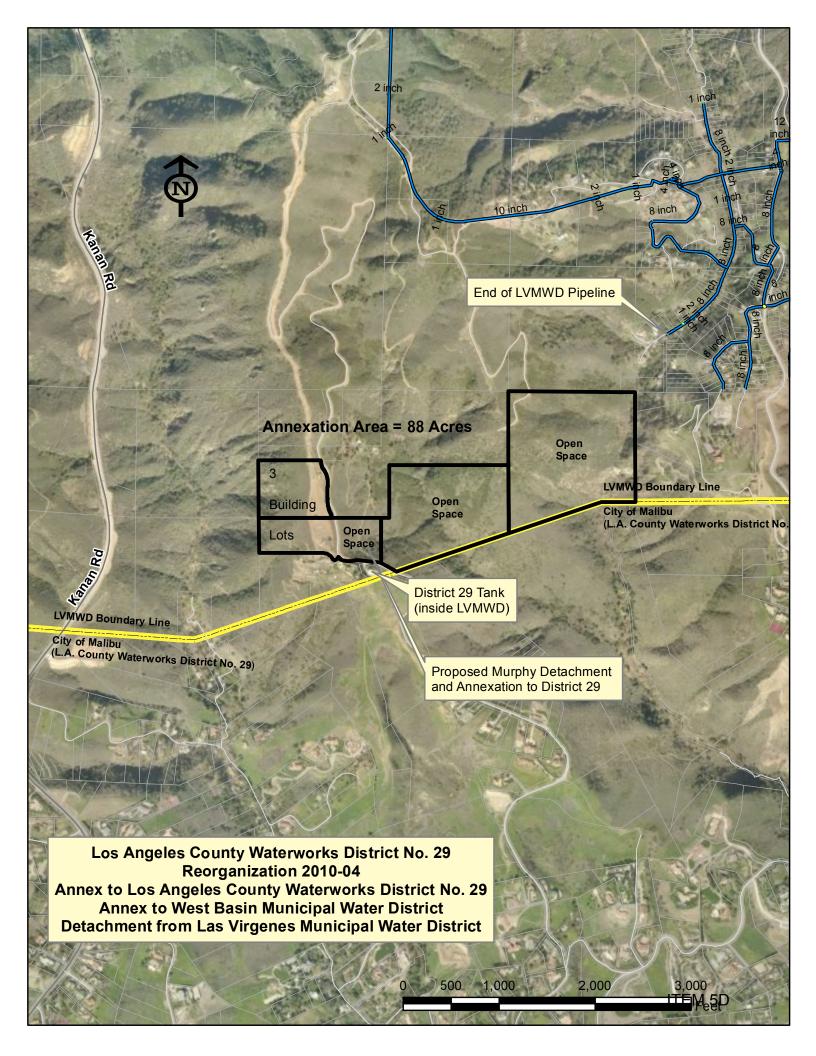
LVMWD would forfeit approximately \$888.00 in yearly Standby Charge fees as well as any future connection fees and future commodity fees for the subject property. Additionally, there would be a transfer of MWDSC Standby Charges to West Basin MWD, collected for and applied to the Readiness to Service Charge, amounting to approximately \$800.00 In the near future there would also be an minimal Negotiated Tax Exchange for the subject property.

RE: Detachment Petition: Southern Boundary

A petition has been filed with LAFCO to detach territory from the southern boundary of the District. The following describes District options with respect to the proposal.

The petition was filed because it is more feasible to serve the property through the water system of Los Angeles County Waterworks District No. 29. In the past, District 29 and Las Virgenes served each other's customers when such circumstance arose. Because of a recent change in the law, LAFCO believes inter-agency cooperation is no longer possible. "Water wheeling" will avoid the complication but the board should address the issue before we go forward.

The District has options, including: (1) oppose the detachment without arranging for water service; (2) oppose the detachment and arrange to wheel water; and (3) do nothing.

The "do nothing" option will probably result in the detachment of the property from the District. Additional detachments will probably occur. This and future detachments will likely have little financial impact. Las Virgenes' very regular southern boundary will be disrupted. Las Virgenes may wish to consider adjusting boundaries for several other properties already receiving water service from District 29. Since Las Virgenes also serves territory within District 29, Las Virgenes may wish to annex those parcels. Thus, the "do nothing" option could result in the District having to "do much."

Las Virgenes does not have to consent to the detachment even if Las Virgenes is unable to service the property. Las Virgenes may be able to permanently prevent detachment and service to the parcel by any other agency. However, Las Virgenes will likely be involved in litigation with the property owner and possibly LAFCO if this option is pursued.

Inter-agency cooperation has been the rule for service to parcels along the southern boundary of Las Virgenes and northern boundary of District 29. These arrangements

have taken a number of forms in absence of the amended LAFCO statute. (On several occasions during the past decades, we contacted the Waterworks District to create a consistent way of dealing with service issues, but in the absence of crisis, no one has been particularly interested in doing anything.) Water wheeling is the most obvious way to address the issue. Under this approach, District 29 would deliver "Las Virgenes water" to property in Las Virgenes through the District 29 system and Las Virgenes would do likewise for property within District 29. Water wheeling is not extraterritorial service. District 29 would not service West Basin water outside territorial limits. District 29 would provide "Las Virgenes water" as a convenience to Las Virgenes. Las Virgenes need not consent to the delivery of water from West Basin into Las Virgenes territory. Wheeling represents no change in the physical status quo, but requires some institutional effort as follows:

- Water owned by West Basin would flow through the Las Virgenes system and
 water owned by Las Virgenes would flow through the West Basin system.
 These two Metropolitan member agencies would formalize the passage of
 water because the San Diego Water Authority is litigating wheeling issues.
 (An agreement can be made with West Basin which will not offer precedence to
 anyone else seeking to wheel water through the Las Virgenes or West Basin
 systems.)
- District No. 29 and Las Virgenes have different charges for commencing service. This is important if the territory changes purveyors at a later date. With the cooperation of Waterworks District 29, appropriate arrangements can be made to deal with this.
- The least difficult financial issue is water rates. The serving entity would charge its own rates and recover its own delivery cost.
- The property owner must be a party to the arrangements.

Because there are other potential detachments (and annexations), the board should be asked to establish a policy which can be applied routinely in the future.

ACWA BYLAWS EXCERPTS RELATING TO COMMITTEES

ARTICLE IV - BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 8. Vacancies for Standing Committee Chairs and Vice Chairs. Should a vacancy occur in the office of any standing committee chair or vice chair before the end of the term, the president shall appoint a new committee chair or vice chair to fulfill the unexpired term of such committee chair or vice chair subject to ratification by the Board of Directors. A vacancy in the office of any such standing committee chair or vice chair as described in the previous sentence shall be deemed to exist when the chair or vice chair: (1) resigns the office; (2) no longer is an officer, employee, or member of the governing body of a member agency of the Association, or other representative duly designated by a member agency of the Association to represent that member; or (3) is otherwise removed by a member agency of the Association.

ARTICLE VII – STANDING COMMITTEES

Section 1. Qualification. In order to serve on any ACWA standing committee, an individual must be an officer, employee, or member of the governing body of a member agency of the Association, or other representative duly designated by a member agency of the Association to represent that member at the time of the appointment. Where an individual ceases to meet these criteria during the term of the appointment, the individual may not serve during the remaining term of that appointment unless that individual can again meet the criteria for appointment and is appointed to complete the term.

Section 2. Term of Office. The term of office of standing committee members shall be two years commencing on January 1 of each even-numbered year. The term of office of standing committee chairs, who serve on the Board of Directors, shall be approximately two years and shall commence as soon after January 1 of the even-numbered year as they may be appointed by the president and ratified by the then-seated Board of Directors, and shall terminate on December 31 of the odd-numbered year approximately two years later or until their successors are appointed and ratified.

Section 3. Meetings. Meetings of standing committees may be called at such times and places designated by the respective chair-thereof except where provided otherwise by these-bylaws. Subject-to the provisions of these bylaws and any actions that may be taken by the Board of Directors, the chairs of each standing committee may establish their own rules for the efficient operation of the committee they each chair. The chairs of each standing committee are authorized to create subcommittees and workgroups in order to complete the work of the committee.

Section 4. Communications Committee. There shall be a Communications Committee whose duty it shall be to develop and make recommendations to the Board of Directors regarding a comprehensive internal and external communications program for the Association and to promote development of sound public information and education programs and practices among members of the Association.

The committee shall consist of no more than 40 individuals. Of that number, at least one individual shall be from each region.

Section 5. Energy Committee. There shall be an Energy Committee whose duty it shall be to recommend policies and programs to the Board of Directors and to the State Legislative Committee and/or Federal Affairs Committee as appropriate. The committee shall consist of at least one representative from each region.

Section 6. Federal Affairs Committee. There shall be a Federal Affairs Committee whose duty it shall be to review all federal legislative proposals and regulatory proposals affecting members of the Association, after consulting with other appropriate committees, and to develop Association positions consistent with existing policy, where it has been established; recommend sponsorship of bills that will resolve problems or improve conditions for members of the Association; and assist in the establishment of the Association's federal legislative program. The committee shall consist of at least one and no more than five individuals from each region.

Section 7. Finance Committee. There shall be a Finance Committee whose duty it shall be to make recommendations to the Board of Directors regarding annual budgets, dues formula and schedules and other revenue-producing income, annual audit and selection of an auditor, and investment strategies. The committee shall consist of the president and vice president of the Association as ex officio members, the Finance Committee chair, one member of the region board from each of the Association's 10 regions (either chair or vice chair), and one additional representative from each region with experience in financial matters.

Section 8. Groundwater Committee. There shall be a Groundwater-Committee whose duty it shall be to recommend policies and programs to the Board of Directors and to the State Legislative Committee and/or Federal Affairs Committee as appropriate. The committee shall consist of at least one representative from each region.

Section 9. Insurance and Personnel-Committee. There shall be an insurance and Personnel Committee whose duty it shall be to review, on a regular basis, all group insurance program offerings, make recommendations to the Board of Directors regarding annual contract renewal of all group employee benefit plans, retirement issues, and other personnel and administrative issues pertinent to the management of members of the Association. The committee shall consist of at least one and no more than two individuals from each region; at least one from each region must represent a member enrolled in multiple plan offerings through the Association.

Section 10. Legal Affairs Committee. There shall be a Legal-Affairs Committee whose duty it shall be to support the mission of the Association, and more particularly to deal with requests for assistance involving legal matters of significance to members of the Association, including but not limited to state and federal court litigation, water rights matters, selected regulatory and resources agency matters, proposed bylaw revisions, review of legislation as requested by the State Legislative Committee, etc. The committee shall consider matters and issues submitted to it in order to determine which ones are of major significance to the members of the Association and, assuming a finding of major significance,

recommend to the Board of Directors the position(s) which the committee believes the Association should take with respect thereto. The committee shall be composed of between 35 and 45 attorneys, each of whom shall be, or act as, counsel for a member of the Association, representing diverse interests within the Association, including but not limited to, different geographical areas throughout the state, large and small agencies, agricultural and urban agencies, agencies created under the various enabling statutes, etc. Further, there shall be at least one representative from each region on the committee.

Section 11. Local Government Committee. There shall be a Local Government Committee whose duty it shall be to recommend policies to the State Legislative Committee, as appropriate, and Board of Directors on matters affecting water agencies as a segment of local government in California. The committee shall consist of at least one and no more than three individuals from each region.

Section 12. State Legislative Committee. There shall be a State Legislative Committee whose duty it shall be to review all state legislative proposals affecting members of the Association and to establish Association positions, consistent with existing policy, where it has been established; sponsor bills that will resolve problems or improve conditions for members of the Association; and assist in the establishment of the Association's legislative program. The committee shall consist of at least one and momer than four individuals from each region. There shall be at least one person representing each of the following types of agencies: (1) California water districts; (2) county water districts; (3) irrigation districts; and (4) municipal water districts. The representatives of the above types of agencies shall be a representative from the regions.

Section 13. Water Management Committee. There shall be a Water Management Committee whose duty it shall be to recommend policy and programs to the Board of Directors on any area of concern in water management. The committee shall consist of at least one and no more than four individuals from each region.

Section 14. Water Quality Committee. There shall be a Water Quality Committee whose duty it shall be to-develop and recommend Association policy, positions, and programs to the Board of Directors, to promote cost-effective state and federal water quality regulations that protect the public health, to enable interested members of the Association to join together to develop and coordinate with other organizations, and to present unified comments regarding agricultural and domestic water quality regulations. The committee shall consist of at least one individual from each region.

ARTICLE VIII - SPECIAL COMMITTEES

Section 2. Membership Committee. There shall be a Membership Committee whose duty it shall be to make recommendations to the Board of Directors regarding membership policies, eligibility, and applications for membership. The committee shall assist staff in developing membership recruitment and retention programs and review and make recommendations to the Finance Committee regarding an equitable dues structure.

ARTICLE X - MISCELLANEOUS

Section 1. Conduct of Meetings. All meetings of the Association shall be conducted in substantial accordance with the latest edition of Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised unless the Board adopts alternate rules of conduct for itself and/or its committees, region boards, and region workgroups.

ACWA POLICY COMMITTEE GUIDELINES

GENERAL COMMITTEES

- All committees of the Association shall strive to provide continuity in leadership, shall geographically distribute membership and shall ensure all regions are adequately represented.
- 2. All committee chairs, vice chairs, and members shall be appointed by the president, and shall serve for a term to coincide with that of the president.
- 3. Nominations for committee appointments shall be made in writing by members for consideration by the region chair and vice chair. If an agency chooses to designate a representative other than a director or salaried staff member, written confirmation to that effect must be received in the ACWA office prior to appointment consideration. Nomination forms (aka Committee Consideration Form) can be obtained from the Association office or on-line at www.acwa.com.
 - a. Where membership on a given ACWA committee is limited, only one agency representative may be appointed. Other individuals representing an agency may serve on subcommittees of that committee.
- 4. The committee chairperson shall:
 - a. chair all meetings of the committee;
 - b. submit a written report regarding-committee-activities for all meetings-of the Board of Directors;
 - appoint a committee-secretary to record all meetings and send copies of the minutes and other material to the-ACWA-effice for distribution to committee members; and
 - d. pre-schedule meetings to foster total committee member attendance.

The vice chairperson shall assume those duties in the chairperson's absence.

- 5. All committee appointments are made by the ACWA president following recommendations submitted by the region chairs and vice chairs. The appointments are for two years and run simultaneously with the board term. -Committee chairpersons may appoint subcommittees as necessary to carry out the committee responsibilities
- 6. Committee chairpersons shall coordinate with other committees that deal with matters of mutual concern.
- 7. Committees shall establish a plan of action for the current term. The plan of action shall include:
 - a. a discussion of the goals for the committee's term;
 - b. a detailed work plan and schedule for accomplishing the goals; and
 - c. committee member assignments to meet the schedule.

The plan of action shall be submitted to the Board of Directors by its first meeting of each term for review and concurrence with the overall ACWA goals. The plan of action for each committee will be forwarded by ACWA to all committee chairpersons, following board review, to help assure concurrence with #6 above.

- 8. Committees shall provide for conference programming if requested.
- 9. Committees shall initiate specific projects/programs based on individual committee purposes, and provide seminar/workshop programming if appropriate.
- 10. Committees shall see that sufficient research is undertaken to guarantee activities/directions are focused on the needs of ACWA members.
- 11. Committees shall evaluate their goals at the end of each term and make appropriate recommendations for consideration by the newly appointed committee.
- 12. Committee members from each region will be designated to act as liaisons at region meetings and provide detailed committee reports.
- 13. A staff liaison will be appointed to the committee by the executive director to assist with the accomplishment of its goals. Staff liaisons may be unable to attend all committee meetings due to scheduling conflicts.
- 14. Certificates of recognition for service shall be distributed to all-committee members at the end of each two-year term.

STANDING AND LIMITED COMMITTEES

- 1. To encourage participation by as many individuals as possible, an individual should-normally serve on only one limited, standing committee.
- 2. Two consecutive, unexcused absences from an ACWA limited committee shall constitute a resignation-and a replacement will be named as soon as possible. Travel is required to any area of the state where a committee meeting is being held, and lack of a travel budget will not constitute an excused absence. Limited committees are:
 - * Communications
 - * Federal Affairs
 - * Finance
 - *-State-Legislative

- * Legal Affairs
- * Local Government
- * Insurance and Personnel
- * Water Management
- 3._ When a region loses a representative on a limited committee due to a change of region by the agency providing the committee member, the region chair will be provided the opportunity to recommend another individual to serve on that limited committee.
- 4. The individual with the district that changed regions with the appointment to the-limited committee will be considered to have automatically resigned his/her appointment.
- 5. No change in region by a member agency can increase the number of limited committee positions within any region.
- 6. When a position becomes available on a limited committee, the appointment will be offered first to any region that is under-represented.

ATTENDANCE

Committee Chair

If a committee chair of a standing committee misses three consecutive ACWA Board meetings, the ACWA President shall appoint a new committee chair. If any committee chair misses three consecutive committee meetings, the ACWA President shall also move to appoint a new committee chair.

Committee Member Alternate (All Committees Except State Legislative)

When a committee member is unable to attend a meeting and has asked for an excused absence in advance of the meeting, they may send a representative from their agency for monitoring purposes only. However, the committee member will still be recorded with an excused absence from the meeting. The representative does not have a voting right.

State Legislative Committee -- Excused Absences and Designation of an Alternate

Active participation by members appointed to the ACWA State Legislative Committee is critical to the success of its mission as described in the ACWA Bylaws (bylaws) and the ACWA Committee Guidelines (guidelines). Therefore, regular attendance is essential. The ACWA committee guidelines state that two unexcused absences from the committee will constitute a resignation of the committee member. The committee member should submit a request for an excused absence to ACWA's Director, State Legislation prior to the committee meeting.

The State Legislative Committee Chair has been asked to provide clarification as to whether a committee member not able to attend a meeting is authorized to designate an alternate to act on behalf of the committee member. ACWA bylaws and committee guidelines do not provide for designation of alternates for committee members. The committee's long-standing practice, however, has been and will continue to be to allow a member of the committee with an excused absence to designate an alternate. The committee member will be required to secure the concurrence of the appropriate ACWA Region Chair for the alternate. The committee member should provide the name of the alternate to ACWA's Director, State Legislation prior to the committee meeting. The alternate will-be authorized to fully-participate in all discussions of the committee and to vote on issues before the committee. Committee members, including alternates, act on behalf of the region for which they were appointed to represent.

ACWA COMMITTEES PURPOSES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

COMMUNICATIONS COMMITTEE - STANDING/LIMITED (40 MAXIMUM) MEETINGS ARE HELD 4 TIMES A YEAR

- One at both the Fall and Spring conferences
- One at the Sacramento office between conferences
- One at a member agencies site between conferences

The purpose of the ACWA Communications Committee is to develop and make recommendations to the Board of Director's and association staff regarding comprehensive internal and external communications/public affairs programs. Programs are crafted to support ACWA and its members' positions on legislative, regulatory, and policy issues.

The committee is responsible for developing and updating a comprehensive communications plan for ACWA. The committee promotes the development and implementation of sound public information and education programs and practices among member agencies. It prepares materials that can be duplicated or used by member agencies for their local public information/education efforts. As a member of the committee, you will be enrolled as an active participant in ACWA's Outreach Program. The committee also provides guidance to ACWA's Communications Department.

ENERGY COMMITTEE – STANDING/UNLIMITED MEETINGS ARE HELD 2 TIMES A YEAR

One at both the Fall and Spring conferences

The purpose of the Energy Committee is to work with staff in developing and making recommendations to the Board of Directors regarding:

- Programs to assure an adequate power supply for member agencies, including energy, availability, pricing, distribution and hydro generation
- Policy recommendations relating to the development of new power sources
- Recommended positions regarding state and federal legislation to the State Legislative and Federal Affairs Committees
- Assistance with the development, direction and work associated with representation before the Public Utilities Commission, the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission and other regulatory agencies dealing with energy
- Educate members on all energy matters having impact on their operations

FEDERAL AFFAIRS COMMITTEE - STANDING/LIMITED (5 PER REGION) MEETINGS ARE HELD 4 TIMES A YEAR

- One at both the Fall and Spring conferences
- Two between conferences (Jan & Sept) in the Sacramento office

The Federal Affairs Committee coordinates with other ACWA committees regarding their input on any issues directly related to federal issues before both Congress and the Federal administrative branches. As a member of the committee, you will be enrolled as an active participant in ACWA's Outreach Program.

The committee currently has four separate subcommittees. Committee members have the opportunity to sign-up for as many of the subcommittees as they want, plus being supplemented by other members with interest in a focused area. The subcommittees with areas of responsibility are:

- <u>Drinking Water & Energy Subcommittee</u>: Responsible for the oversight and policy direction on Environmental Protection Agency and Energy-Water Nexus.
- Water Supply Subcommittee: Responsible for oversight and policy direction on the Safe Drinking Water Act and Endangered Species Act.
- <u>Infrastructure & Agriculture Subcommittee</u>: Responsible for oversight and policy direction on the Clean Water Act, and agricultural issues.
- Finance, Technology & Research Subcommittee: Responsible for oversight and policy direction on financing water infrastructure legislation.

FINANCE COMMITTEE - STANDING/LIMITED (2 PER REGION—1 SPOT IS FILLED BY REGION CHAIR OR VICE CHAIR; OTHER SPOT IS FILLED BY A REPRESENTATIVE FROM REGION WITH EXPERIENCE IN FINANCIAL MATTERS)

MEETINGS ARE HELD APPROXIMATELY 4-5 TIMES A YEAR.

- One at both the Fall and Spring conferences
- All other meetings are held in the Sacramento office

The Finance Committee makes recommendations to the Board of Directors regarding annual budgets, investment strategies, annual audits and the selection of the auditor, the dues formula and schedules and other financial matters that may come before the committee. Each committee member will be expected to serve on at least one of the subcommittees, which are:

- Audit Subcommittee
- Budget Subcommittee
- ◆ Investment Subcommittee
- Revenue Subcommittee
- Education Subcommittee

GROUNDWATER COMMITTEE - STANDING/UNLIMITED MEETINGS ARE HELD 4 TIMES A YEAR

- One at both the Fall and Spring conferences
- One in Northern California between conferences
- One in Southern California between conferences

The Groundwater Committee monitors state and federal regulations and legislation that could affect the quality or quantity of groundwater, conducts studies, develops policies regarding the management of groundwater and coordinates with other ACWA committees on issues directly related to groundwater.

Committee members are expected to participate in a variety of activities including writing legislation, preparing comments for state or federal hearings on groundwater issues, developing programs for workshops and conferences, and providing input on state and federal legislation. SUMMARY:

At the May 11, 2010 meeting, the Board directed staff to request quotes from local dealerships for vehicle purchases in Fiscal Year 2009-2010. For fiscal year 2011-12 the same direction was followed for the vehicle replacement program. This fiscal year two (2) ¾ ton and two (2) ½ ton trucks are to be purchased and four (4) trucks are to be declared surplus.

RECOMMENDATION(S):

Authorize the General Manager to issue a purchase order to Paradise Chevrolet of Ventura in the amount of \$54,097.12 for the purchase of two (2), 2011 ¾ ton utility body service trucks; authorize the General Manager to issue a purchase order to Vista Ford of Woodland Hills in the amount of \$40,432.62 for the purchase of two (2), 2011 ½ ton standard cab trucks; and declare vehicles 810, 837, 838, 840, and 856 surplus vehicles.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

The Fiscal Year 2011-12 Capital Improvement budget allocated \$110,000 under account # 10488.1880.505 for the vehicle replacement program.

DISCUSSION:

Request for quotes were sent to several dealerships and responses were as follows:

(2) 2011 3/4 ton utility body service trucks

- 1. Paradise Chevrolet of Ventura \$54,097.12
- 2. Vista Ford of Woodland Hills \$56.521.10
- 3. William L. Morris Chevrolet of Fillmore \$60,904.86

(2) 2011 ½ ton standard cab trucks

- 1. Vista Ford of Woodland Hills \$40,432.62
- 2. Paradise Chevrolet of Ventura \$40,552.12
- 3. William L. Morris Chevrolet of Fillmore \$41.047.12

Paradise Chevrolet provided the lowest bid for two (2) ¾ ton utility body service trucks in the amount of \$54,097.12. Vista Ford of Woodland Hills provided the lowest bid for two (2) ½ ton standard cab trucks in the amount of \$40,432.62. This process has reduced delivery time and advertising costs while providing competitive bids and vehicles meeting all required specifications.

Subject: Cornell Pump Station Engine Rebuild

SUMMARY:

Cornell Pump Station, Pump #2 is driven by a Waukesha natural gas engine. The engine is in need of a routine overhaul to extend the life of the engine and to reduce maintenance costs. The engine currently has approximately 33,054.70 hours of run time. Staff has received three bids from engine service providers for the repairs. The lowest bid for the repairs is \$69,883.93 from Emissions Compliant Controls Corporation. Staff is requesting the purchase order be approved in the amount not to exceed \$95,000 to cover unexpected costs that can occur during a major engine overhaul. The bid consists of parts, labor, and outside services. The parts for this repair have an estimated 90 day delivery date. Staff is recommending a two part purchase order to allow Emissions Compliant Controls Corporation to purchase and receive the parts prior to the start of repairs. The parts are factory certified with an estimated cost of \$30,000.

RECOMMENDATION(S):

Authorize the General Manager to issue a purchase order to Emissions Compliant Controls Corporation in the amount not to exceed \$95,000 for the repair and overhaul of Cornell pump #2, Waukesha engine; and authorize a two payment system to allow for the purchase and procurement of all repair parts prior to the engine overhaul.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

The Fiscal Year 2011-12 Capital Improvement budget allocated \$100,000 under account # 10398.1880.505 for Cornell Pump Station engine rebuild.

Subject: AMR/AMI FY 2011/2012 Installation Project: Purchase Order for Equipment and Installation

SUMMARY:

At the June 28th Board meeting, nine public speakers expressed concerns about AMR meters and the health dangers they present to people. Theses included interference with medical devices, cumulative effects with other radio frequency sources, effect on children, pregnant women, the elderly and the immuno-compromised, eletro-hypersensitivity, etc. They were also critical of the technology as pointed out by some studies. To address these, staff has retained two experts in the field to present to the Board and to respond to questions tonight. The resumes of Dr. Leeka I. Kheifets and Mr. Adrian E. Popa are attached. In addition, staff will also respond to other issues raised at the meeting related to privacy, opting out, rate of return on investment, lack of public notice, etc.

The installation of Automatic Meter Reading/Advanced Metering Infrastructure (AMR/AMI) is in the second year of the Board-approved five-year Infrastructure Investment Program. To date, 4,379 services have been upgraded with the new equipment and the current year's goal is to install another 3,274 plus replace 500 of the older legacy units. The Datamatic Firefly system has the flexibility to be operated in either drive-by mode or a mesh network (AMI) that transmits information via cell phone to a data server. The choice depends on several factors that include topography, number and proximity of services, availability of sites for data transmission infrastructure and cost.

The project moves into that phase where AMI installation is feasible. Last year's work was performed using a combination of District staff, hired temporary workers and a contractor working with Datamatic. Work directly provided by the District, at a cost of \$92 per meter, included cleaning the meter boxes, removing the replacing the meters, wiring, programming and installation of new lids. Datamatic offers to perform these same tasks at a reduced cost \$43.00 per meter for this fiscal year's deployment. Datamatic has completed many installations for other utilities in this turn-key fashion. It is estimated that deployment will be completed in four months.

The attached quotation dated July 6, 2011 provides a cost breakdown for equipment and labor, including a trade-in credit for upgrading the legacy units.

RECOMMENDATION(S):

Authorize the General Manager to issue a purchase order to Datamatic in the amount of \$595,507.70 plus sales tax in the amount of \$36,008, for the complete deployment of 3,774 AMR/AMI meters.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

Funds are available in the current Capital Improvement Project No. 10450 in the amount of \$1,050,000.

Second Claim from Rodric White

SUMMARY

On June 20, 2011 the District received a claim from Rodric White of West Hills. Mr. White suffered damage to his car when a district vehicle backed into him on Kanan Road in front of El Pollo Loco restaurant. The claim is for \$2773.35 to repair the car and \$48.99 plus tax per day for a rental car from 5 to 8 days (if the repair goes over a weekend) for a estimated total of \$3,194.66. The Board accepted this claim from Mr. White at the regular meeting on July 12, 2011.

Unlike some of the claims we have received in the past, Mr. White did not want to pay for the damage and then submitted invoices to the District. Staff agreed to pay for damage to the car directly to the dealer. Mr. White agreed to pay for the rental car and then file for reimbursement.

The dealer stayed within his estimate and received his check before the car was due to be released to Mr. White. However, there was a delay due to the paint job and Mr. White had to keep his rental for another day. Also, the original rental cost estimate was not complete. The difference between what was approved for Mr. White and what he is submitting to the District for reimbursement of rental expenses is \$295.43. The original estimate was for up to eight days but the actual number was ten (the rental company charges on a 24-hour rate, so going a few hours into another day meant a full day charge). Also, the rental company did not inform of the ancillary charges.

Since the Board approved accepting and settling the claim by Mr. White, staff recommends that this additional amount of \$295.43 be approved and the claim closed. This amount is within the discretion of the General Manager.
