

LONG VALLEY ROAD - POTABLE WATER PIPELINE REPLACEMENT

BETWEEN OLD FARM AND SADDLE CREEK ROADS



THE PROJECT

The potable water pipeline that provides fire protection and serves residences along a portion of Long Valley Road has reached the end of its service life. The original pipeline was installed before Las Virgenes Municipal Water District was formed in 1958. Recently, there have been a number of breaks in the line, causing service interruptions and bringing repair crews to the neighborhood.

WHAT'S BEING DONE

Las Virgenes Municipal Water District intends to replace approximately 1,300 feet of water line serving the customers along Long Valley Road. In addition, the hydrants on this line will be brought up to newer standards.

TIMEFRAME

Once the project is underway, it is expected to be complete by the first week of July. Work hours will be from 8:00 a.m. to 4 p.m. Certain unforeseen conditions such as weather, materials delivery or equipment malfunctions may cause deviations in the announced schedule but we will keep the community informed.

WHAT TO EXPECT

During the construction period, customer water service will be maintained through a temporary above-ground "high line" that will connect to the meter serving each property in the project area. When the project is finished, normal underground connections will be restored and any disturbed pavement will be brought back its original condition. There will be brief interruptions in water service as the connections are changed to and from the high line. After these changes, you may experience brief air pockets in the flow when your water is running.

The use of a "high line" will require the installation of temporary driveway ramps to protect the service line. Those ramps will be removed at the completion of the project.

Construction will occur during daytime hours on week-days. There will be no work performed during night time hours, on weekends or holidays.

During the project, a variety of construction equipment will be used, such as backhoes, delivery trucks and power tools.

Because of the presence of construction equipment and materials, uneven surfaces and the like, it is requested that recreational activities such as equestrians, bicycling, hiking and skating should avoid the project area until construction is complete.
