7. BOARD OF DIRECTORS

A Assembly Bill No. 72 - Support If Amended

Approve a position of "Support if Amended" for Assembly Bill No. 72, pertaining to newly elected municipal water district directors, requesting an amendment to provide for newly elected directors to take office on the first Friday of the month following the election.

On a motion by Director Leonard Polan, seconded by Director Glen Peterson, the Board of Directors voted 4-0 -1 to Approve the recommendation as presented.

B Video Recordings of Board Meetings: Review of Options and Costs

Review the options and updated costs for performing video recordings of Board meetings, select the preferred option, and direct staff to proceed with implementation accordingly.

General Manager Pedersen provided an overview of Board actions over the past fourteen months pertaining to audio/video recordings of board meetings and transcription of minutes; and Director of Resource Conservation and Public Outreach Reyes gave a presentation entitled "Video Recording of Board Meetings: Review of Options and Costs".

One speaker card was received from the public (1) Mr. Stephen Bigilen who discussed his history of video recordings for previous District meetings (NPDES permit renewal and the proposed 5-Mil Tank project workshops); community needs to hear about issues; his business is local (Agoura); portable equipment, which can be moved from one location to another (HD cameras); ability to index and post the video to District's web page. In response to Board questions Mr. Bigilen stated he has been in business for twenty-seven years, has not ever missed a shoot and has back-up camera people who assist if he is absent; discussed video recording options related to presentations and stated it's the same charge for one camera up to four cameras.

A summary of Board of Directors' comments included: capture the number of times video recordings are accessed by unique users (internal/external) using Google Analytics "hit counter" in order to gauge public interest versus cost; index as it's important to have a user friendly video; and start with in-house video recordings and go further if used by public.

Director Glen Peterson made a motion for Option 3 - Third-Party Video Recording TEMARA a

"hit counter" to identify unique users; Director Barry Steinhardt made a motion for Option 2 - In-House Video Recording and stated he does not feel the video recording process should be held up based on whether or not a "hit counter" is available to track unique users.

Director Glen Peterson made a substitute motion for Option 3 - Third-Party Video Recording for 20 meetings to be indexed using a maximum of three cameras.

On a motion by Director Glen Peterson, seconded by Director Charles Caspary, the Board of Directors voted 4-0 -1 to Approve the substitute motion made by Director Glen Peterson.

- **B** Director's Reports on Outside Meetings

Director Polan reported on his attendance at the ACWA Legislative Symposium, which was also attended by Directors Peterson and Steinhardt, discussions included the water bond; resiliency of the Sacramento Delta; effects of global warming on the snow pack; breaking the paradigm of North versus South for water; and stated Senator Pavley is a key player in water issues. Director Steinhardt reported on support of Delta Restoration/levees; water resources; storage due to climate change; and flood control.

Director Steinhardt also reported on his attendance at the SCEWRI Symposium, which was also attended by Directors Peterson and Polan, high level discussions pertaining to the effects of climate change and what it means to water resource managers. Director Peterson reported

that Senator Rubio who had been a key player in regards to CEQA reform resigned; ACWA and EWRI had many of the same speakers; and a geologist presented information on carbon/sulfur cycles. Director Polan reported on a statistical model presentation of water in the San Joaquin Valley and requested information on the California Landscape Conservation Cooperative.

Director Caspary requested an update on central valley storage and pumping (Director Peterson stated the project was at 25%).

- (1) General Manager Pedersen provided an update on general business of the District including upcoming calendar events (AWA, RCDSMM watershed tour, special meetings to discuss strategic planning/labor negotiations and a JPA watershed tour, Earth Day); and reported on his introduction to the Agoura Hills City Council, an upcoming tour with Director Steinhardt and John Loesing of The Acorn, Heal the Bay's watershed on the brink report and discussed the County of Los Angeles hearing on Clean Water, Clean Beaches, which will become a ballot issue.

SUMMARY:

Approval of this action would enable the District to continue its formal participation in the Greater Los Angeles County Integrated Regional Water Management Plan (IRWMP) effort as a voting member of the Leadership Committee.

RECOMMENDATION(S):

Authorize the General Manager to execute a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the District and other members of the Greater Los Angeles County Integrated Regional Water Management Plan (IRWMP) Leadership Committee for the purpose of developing, administering, updating, and implementing the Greater Los Angeles County IRWMP.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

Staff participation in the IRWMP effort is included in the approved Fiscal Year 2012-13 Budget.

DISCUSSION:

The Greater Los Angeles County IRWMP effort is part of a statewide program to take a collaborative, regional approach to manage all aspects of water resources. The IRWMP process includes consideration to develop and conserve water supplies, improve water quality, and enhance aquatic habitat. The Greater Los Angeles County IRWMP was completed in mid-2006 and adopted on December 13, 2006.

In the greater Los Angeles County area, the IRWMP effort is administered by a Leadership Committee consisting of key stakeholders representing five watershed areas (Lower San Gabriel, North Santa Monica Bay, South Bay, Upper Los Angeles, and Upper San Gabriel) and five water management areas (groundwater, open space, sanitation, stormwater, and surface water). Since 2006, the District has participated as a member of the Leadership Committee, representing the North Santa Monica Bay Watershed.

Participation on the Leadership Committee is guided by an MOU that describes the purpose and goals of the IRWMP and the functions and terms of participation on the Leadership Committee. Any public agency may participate on the Leadership Committee informally as an ex officio member, but voting privileges are limited to signatories of the MOU. The District is a signatory to an existing MOU for participation on the Leadership Committee; however, the MOU expired on December 31, 2012. The attached draft MOU would renew the expired MOU with substantially the same terms and a new expiration date of December 31, 2017.

Memorandum of Understanding for Integrated Regional Water Management Planning and Implementation

This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) is entered into by and among the following entities which are members of the Greater Los Angeles County Region Integrated Regional Water Management Plan Leadership Committee for the purpose of developing, administering, updating and implementing an Integrated Regional Water Management Plan for the Greater Los Angeles County Region: Las Virgenes Municipal Water District, Cities of Los Angeles, Malibu, Torrance, City of Los Angeles Department of Water and Power, Council for Watershed Health, Los Angeles County Flood Control District, Main San Gabriel Basin Watermaster, Metropolitan Water District, Raymond Basin Management Board, Rivers and Mountains Conservancy, San Gabriel Basin Water Quality Authority, Sanitation Districts of Los Angeles County, Santa Monica Bay Restoration Commission, Water Replenishment District, West Basin Municipal Water District. Signatories to this MOU shall hereinafter be referred to individually as "Party" or collectively as "Parties."

RECITALS

WHEREAS, it is in the interests of the Parties, and the region served by the Parties, that the water resources the Parties share in common are responsibly managed, protected, and conserved to the extent feasible; and,

WHEREAS, most of the Parties entered into an MOU in 2008 to coordinate and share information concerning water resources management planning programs and projects and other information for grant funding and Integrated Regional Water Management Plan (IRWMP) implementation, and to improve and maintain overall communication among the Parties which is set to expire on December 31, 2012.

WHEREAS, the Parties desire to enter into a new MOU to continue as a Regional Water Management Group (RWMG) to develop, administer, update and implement an IRWMP for the Greater Los Angeles County Region (defined in Exhibit A and hereinafter referred to as GLAC IRWM Region), in accordance with the Integrated Regional Water Management Planning Act of 2002, Division 6, Part 2.2 of the California Water Code as such Act may be amended hereafter.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is mutually understood and agreed as follows:

The recitals set forth above are incorporated herein and constitute a part of the MOU among the Parties.

Upon the effective date of this MOU, the RWMG is hereby continued and includes each of the Parties.

SECTION 1: PURPOSES AND GOALS

1.1 Purposes and Goals:

The Parties desire to continue to coordinate and share information concerning water resources management planning programs and projects and other information for grant funding and IRWMP implementation, and to improve and maintain overall communication among the Parties. It is anticipated that coordination and information sharing among the Parties will assist the agencies in achieving their respective missions and contribute to the overall well-being of the GLAC IRWM Region. It is expected that all Parties will cooperate and coordinate with one another in order to achieve these goals.

SECTION 2: JOINT AGENCY PLANNING FOR PROJECTS AND PROGRAMS

2.1 Projects and Programs:

It is the intent of the Parties that they coordinate and collaborate as a RWMG to develop and implement projects and programs. Such coordination can achieve greater benefits than single purpose projects. Applicable projects and programs include, but are not limited to, the following:

- 2.1.1 An IRWMP for the GLAC IRWM Region.
- 2.1.2 Solicitation of external funding for implementation of the IRWMP for the GLAC IRWM Region.
- 2.2 Formation of the RWMG and Adoption of the IRWMP:
 - 2.2.1 Leadership Committee signatories that execute this MOU shall constitute the RWMG pursuant to Cal. Water Code section 10539. The RWMG shall facilitate the development and implementation of the IRWMP for the GLAC IRWM Region. Adoption of the IRWMP for the GLAC IRWM Region in accordance with the Integrated Regional Water Management Planning Act of 2002 requires a simple majority vote of the RWMG.
 - 2.2.2 The RWMG established by execution of this MOU will serve as the RWMG for the GLAC IRWM Region IRWM Program.
- 2.3 Operations of the RWMG.
 - 2.3.1 The Parties acknowledge that previously adopted Operating Page 2 of 7

Guidelines, which serve as the basis for the RWMG's decision-making process, will be reviewed and revisions will be proposed by the RWMG as necessary.

- 2.4 Endorsement by Other entities.
- 2.4.1 Other entities are encouraged to endorse this MOU by passing a resolution to demonstrate support for the GLAC-IRWM Region's IRWMP. Such endorsements do not obligate said entities beyond the demonstration of support for regional water management cooperation. Said entities will not be members of the RWMG or Parties unless they are added by amendment to the MOU upon agreement of Parties.

SECTION 3: GENERAL PROVISIONS

- 3.1 Term: This MOU shall become effective upon signature or counter-signature of a majority of the Parties and shall expire on December 31, 2017, or upon its replacement by the adoption of a subsequent MOU, Agreement, or Joint Powers Authority Agreement, or unless earlier terminated by mutual written agreement of a majority of the Parties. Any Party may terminate its participation in this MOU upon 60 days' written notice to the remaining Parties.
- 3.2 Construction of Terms: This MOU is for the sole benefit of the Parties and shall not be construed as granting rights to any person other than the Parties or imposing obligations on a Party to any person other than another Party.
- 3.3 Good Faith: Each Party shall use its best efforts and work wholeheartedly and in good faith for the expeditious completion of the purposes and goals of this MOU and the satisfactory performance of its terms.
- 3.4 Governing Law: This MOU is made under and shall be governed by the laws of the State of California.
- 3.5 Execution: This MOU may be executed in counterparts and the signed counterparts shall constitute a single instrument. The signatories to this MOU represent that they have the authority to bind their respective Party to this MOU.
- 3.6 Succession: Successor appointees shall sign this MOU prior to being seated on the Leadership Committee.
- 3.7 Administration: The Chair of the Leadership Committee will be responsible for the ongoing administration of the MOU.
- 3.8 Financial Commitment: Neither the signing of this MOU nor the adoption by the governing boards of the Parties commits any Party to any financial obligation.

- 3.9 Severability: The provisions of this MOU shall be deemed severable, and the invalidity, illegality or unenforceability of any provision of this MOU shall not affect the validity or enforceability of any other provisions. In the event any provision of this MOU is found to be invalid, illegal, or unenforceable, the Parties shall endeavor to modify that clause in a manner which gives effect to the intent of the Parties in entering into this MOU.
- 3.10 This MOU may be amended or modified only by written mutual consent of all Parties that are members of the RWMG at the time of such amendment or modification. No waiver of any term or condition of this MOU or any Party shall be a continuing waiver thereof.
- 3.11 There may be additional Parties entering into this MOU by amendment. Any MOU amendment adding a new Party or Parties must be approved by all Parties.
- 3.12 If any provision of the MOU is held, determined or adjudicated to be illegal, void or unenforceable by a court of competent jurisdiction, the Parties agree that the remainder of this MOU shall be given effect to the fullest extent possible.

Subject: Updated Legislative Policy Principles

SUMMARY:

During the course of state and federal legislative sessions, or when regulatory changes are under consideration, staff will often submit written comments on matters of interest or concern to the District. Many of these communications are time-critical, especially as proposed legislation enters committee hearings, where changes to bills can occur quickly with approaching legislative deadlines.

To respond timely and ensure that the Board's positions on the various issues are represented appropriately, staff utilizes a set of parameters referred to as the Legislative Policy Principles to formulate its response and comments on proposed legislation within a broad policy framework approved by the Board. Response or comments on items that fall outside the approved framework are brought before the Board for evaluation and direction.

• Climate Change:

SUPPORT legislation to assist with modification of existing facilities and investment in new infrastructure to ensure that California's water supply infrastructure can meet the challenges resulting from or exacerbated by climate change.

SUPPORT legislation that advances federal and state policy to provide incentives and financial assistance for local investment in measures to mitigate the potential effects of climate change.

Colorado River:

SUMMARY:

On February 12, 2013, the Board approved plans and specifications for the 1,235-foot Backbone Improvements Project, Calabasas Pipeline, and authorized a Call for Bids in accordance with the project specifications and proposed bid schedule. The scope of the project includes the installation of 9,475 feet of 30-inch diameter cement mortar lined and coated welded steel pipe along Mureau Road and Las Virgenes Road in the unincorporated Los Angeles County area and the City of Calabasas, including 500 feet of jackand-bore underneath the 101 Freeway. Construction bids were opened on April 2, 2013, and the project is scheduled to be awarded on April 23, 2013.

The District has worked with the City of Calabasas, County of Los Angeles, and California Transportation Department (Caltrans) for traffic control requirements, including construction hours and other restrictions for the project. All of the required permits from those agencies have been obtained. The District's staff met with representatives of the Mountain View Estates Homeowners Association (HOA) during the design to incorporate the HOA's concerns and comments in the plans and specifications.

Attachment is a map showing the various segments of the project and the associated working hours and restrictions, which were designed to minimize construction impacts to the public. The District contacted the California Highway Patrol (CHP) about the locations of message signage, where necessary, to warn the motorists of potential delays on the surface streets. Also attached is a document showing typical cross-sections of Mureau Road to indicate the location of the proposed pipeline and traffic control measures.

Staff's public outreach plan for the project includes the following components:

- 1. Road signs erected 30 days (or more) prior to project start
- 2. Web posting and weekly updates (w/photos), more if needed
- 3. U.S. Mail notice to all impacted homes and businesses prior to start of construction
- 4. Specific Outreach to Mountain View Estates HOA
- 5. Presentation to Calabasas City Council
- 6. Notification to County of Los Angeles
- 7. News releases to The Acorn, Enterprise, Daily News, cities, and Hidden Hills HOA
- 8. Ads in The Acorn, Enterprise, Daily News before & during project
- 9. Notifications to bicycle & equestrian communities
- 10. Notifications on city (Hidden Hills and Calabasas) and County of Los Angeles websites
- 11. Construction hotline active and monitored
- 12. Meet again with Mountain View Estates HOA
- 13. Coordinate with Mountain View Estates HOA landscapers.

The plans and specifications also have provisions for the contractor to temporarily stop work when there is an emergency situation (red flag fire alert and/or traffic accident) in the area.
