Subject: Public Hearing: 2013 Report on Water Quality Relative to Public Health Goals

#### SUMMARY:

Public water systems serving more than 10,000 service connections must prepare a brief, written report in plain language every three years to provide customers with information on the detection of any contaminants above the Public Health Goals (PHGs) published by the California Office of Environmental Health Hazard Assessment (OEHHA). Staff completed the required report after analyzing constituents found in LVMWD's drinking water. Since PHGs are not enforceable standards, the report is only for informational purposes; no additional action is required.

#### **RECOMMENDATION(S):**

Conduct a public hearing for the 2013 Report on Water Quality Relative to Public Health Goals (LVMWD Report No. 2522.00); accept and respond to public comments; and approve and file the report.

#### **FINANCIAL IMPACT:**

There is no financial impact associated with this action.

#### **DISCUSSION:**

Senate Bill 1307 requires public water systems to prepare a water quality report on PHGs by July 1st of every third year. The triennial report is intended to provide PHG information in addition to the annual Consumer Confidence Report provided to each customer. The report must provide information in plain language on detection of any PHG constituents in concentrations above the prescribed levels. PHGs are based solely on public health risk considerations.

It is important to distinguish PHGs from Maximum Contaminant Levels (MCLs) set by the U.S. EPA or California Department of Public Health (CDPH); MCLs consist of enforceable primary drinking water standards. The PHGs are not enforceable and are not required to be met by public water systems. Maximum Contaminant Level Goals (MCLGs) are the federal equivalent to California's PHGs. A public hearing is required to provide the public with an opportunity to respond to the report.

# LAS VIRGENES MUNICIPAL WATER DISTRICT 2013 REPORT ON WATER QUALITY RELATIVE TO PUBLIC HEALTH GOALS LVMWD Report No. 2522

# Background

Provisions of the California Health and Safety Code specify that larger (>10,000 service connections) water utilities orepare a special report by July 1, 2013 if their water quality measurements have exceeded any Public Health Goals (PHGs). PHGs are non-enforceable goals established by the Cal-EPA's office of Environmental Health Hazard Assessment (OEHHA). The law also requires that where OEHHA has not adopted a PHG for a constituent, the water suppliers are to use the Maximum Containment Level Goal MCLGs adopted by the US EPA. Only constituents which have a California preliminary drinking water standard and for which either a PHG or MCLG has been set are to be addressed.

There are few constituents that are routinely detected in water systems at levels usually well below the drinking water standards for which no PHG nor MCLG has yet been adopted by OEHHA or US EPA including Total Trihalomethanes. These will be addressed in a future report after a PHG has been adopted.

The law specifies what information is to be provided in the report.

If a constituent was detected in LVMWD's water supply between 2010 and 2012 at a level exceeding an applicable PHG or MCLG, this report provides the information required by law. Included is:

- a. the numerical public health risk associated with MCL and the PHG or MCLG,
- b. the category or type of risk to health that could be associated which with each constituent,
- c. the best treatment technology available that could be used to reduce the constituent level, and
- d. an estimate of the cost to install that treatment if it is appropriate and feasible.

#### What are PHGs?

PHGs are set by the California Office of Environmental Health Hazard Assessment (OEHHA) which is a part of Cal-EPA and are based solely on public health risk considerations. None of the practical risk-management factors that are considered by the US EPA or the California Department of Public Health (CDPH) in setting drinking water standards (MCLs) are considered in setting the PHGs. These factors include analytical detection capability, treatment technology

available, benefits and costs. The PHGs are not enforceable and are not required to be met by any public water system. MCLGs are the federal equivalent PHGs.

# Water Quality Data Considered

All of the water quality data collected in the water system between 2010 and 2012 for purposes of determining compliance with drinking water standards were considered. This data was summarized in the LVMWD's 2010, 2011 and 2012 Consumer Confidence Reports which have previously been mailed to customers.

For each regulated contaminant, CDPH establishes Detection Limits for Purposes of Reporting (DLR). DLRs are the minimum levels at which any analytical result must be reported to CDPH. Analytical results below the DLRs cannot be quantified with any certainty. In some cases PHG's are set below the DLRs.

In addition to information from LVMWD's distribution system, information for Metropolitan Water District of Southern California (MWD) is also provided. MWD is the wholesaler from whom LVMWD purchases the source water distributed to customers.

#### **Guidelines Followed**

The Association of California Water Agencies (ACWA) formed a workgroup which prepared guidelines for water utilities to use in preparing these PHG reports. The ACWA guidelines were used in preparation of this report. Guidance was also available from state regulatory agencies.

# **Best Available Treatment Technology and Cost Estimates**

Both the USEPA and CDPH adopt what are known as BATs or Best Available Technologies which are the best known methods of reducing contaminant levels to the MCL. Costs can be estimated for such technologies. However, since many PHGs and all MCLGs are set much lower than the MCL, it is not always possible or feasible to determine what treatment is needed to further reduce a constituent downward to or near the PHG or the MCLG, many of which are set at zero. Estimating the costs to reduce a constituent to zero is difficult, if not impossible, because it is not possible to verify by analytical means that the level has been lowered to zero. In some cases, installing treatment to try and further reduce very low levels of one constituent may have adverse effects on other aspects of water quality.

#### Constituents Detected That Exceed a PHGs or MCLGs

The following is a discussion of constituents that were detected in the drinking water at levels above the PHG, or if no PHG, above the MCLG.

#### **Total Coliform Bacteria**

There is no PHG for coliform; the MCLG for coliform is 0% positive tests for coliform. The MCL for coliform is less than 5% positive samples of all samples per month.

The reason for the coliform drinking water standard is to minimize the possibility of water containing pathogens which are organisms that cause waterborne disease. Because coliform is only a surrogate indicator of the potential presence of pathogens, it is not possible to state a specific numerical health risk. While US EPA normally sets MCLGs "at a level where no known or anticipated adverse effects on persons would occur", they indicate that they cannot do so with coliform.

Coliform bacteria are an indicator organism that are ubiquitous in nature and not generally considered harmful. They are used because of the ease in monitoring and analysis. If a positive sample is found, it indicates a potential problem that needs to be investigated and follow up sampling is done. It is not at all unusual for a system to have an occasional positive sample. It is difficult, if not impossible to assure that a system will never get a positive sample.

During the years of 2010, 2011 and 2012, between 77 and 114 water samples were collected in the LVMWD system every month for coliform analysis. The highest monthly percentage found to be positive for the total coliform bacteria was 1.25%. All positive results were re-sampled and re-samples tested negative for coliform presence.

The technologies identified for achieving compliance with total coliform MCL by CDPH are:

- a. Maintenance of disinfectant residual throughout the distribution system;
- b. Proper maintenance of the distribution system;
- c. Watershed protection; and
- d. Filtration and/or disinfection of approved surface water.

LVMWD has already taken all of the steps described by CDPH as "best available technology" for coliform bacteria in Section 64447, Title 22, CCR. Our program consists of:

- An effective cross-connection control program;
- Maintenance of disinfectant residual throughout the system;
- An effective monitoring program;
- System flushing;
- Rapid response to system failures;

- 24-hour system coverage and response;
- Filtration and disinfection of water from Las Virgenes Reservoir; and
- Maintenance of positive pressure in the distribution system.

#### Arsenic

The PHG is 0.004 ppb. The California MCL for arsenic is 10 ppb. Arsenic is a metallic element and is a result of erosion of rocks and minerals containing arsenic. Other sources of arsenic in water include the use of agricultural pesticides and chemicals for timber preservation.

The category of health risk associated with arsenic is that people who drink water containing arsenic above the MCL for many years may experience an increased risk of cancer. The numerical health risk of ingesting drinking water with arsenic at the PHG is  $4\times10^{-6}$ , or four additional theoretical cancer cases in one million people drinking two liters of water a day for 70 years.

All of the source water samples for arsenic were less than 4.1 ppb, significantly less than the MCL of 10 ppb, but higher than the PHG. Based on sampling of the distribution system, arsenic was detected at levels between ND and 4.1ppb.

The BATs for arsenic removal is either ion exchange and/or reverse osmosis. Ion exchange is the more cost-effective of these two technologies. The estimated cost to install, lease and operate an ion exchange system that reduces arsenic levels is estimated at \$5.7 million, or \$258 annually per customer.

# **Gross Alpha Particle Activity**

Although there is no PHG for gross alpha, the MCLG is 0 pCi/L and the MCL is 15 pCi/L. Gross alpha is a radiological compound that is naturally occurring in the environment.

Gross Alpha has been shown to cause cancer in laboratory animals such as rats and mice when the animals are exposed to high levels over their lifetimes. Constituents that cause cancer in laboratory animals also may increase the risk of cancer in humans who are exposed over long periods of time. CDPH has set the drinking water standard for gross alpha at 15 pCi/L to reduce the risk of cancer, or other adverse health affects that have been observed in laboratory animals.

Gross alpha particle activity was detected at levels up to 7.3 in the source water supplied to LVMWD. The levels detected in our system were below the MCL at all times, but were over the US EPA's MCLG of 0 pCi/L.

The BAT identified to treat radiological contaminants is reverse osmosis (RO). The most effective and economical treatment system is to use the RO treatment

at select reservoir and surface water connection sites. LVMWD has determined that the cost to install and operate an RO removal system to meet the reservoir and surface water connections in the system in order to meet the PHG levels would be approximately \$14.6 million which includes construction and annual operational costs. This would be an annual cost to each customer of \$667.

## **Gross Beta Particle Activity**

As with gross alpha, there is no PHG for gross beta. The MCLG for gross beta is 0 pCi/L, and the MCL is 50 pCi/L. Gross beta is a radiological compound that is naturally occurring in the environment.

Gross beta has been shown to cause cancer in laboratory animals when the animals are exposed to high levels over their lifetimes. Constituents that cause cancer in laboratory animals also may increase the risk of cancer in humans who are exposed over long periods of time. CDPH has set the drinking water standard for gross beta at 50 pCi/L to reduce the risk of cancer in humans, or other adverse health affects that have been observed in laboratory animals.

During the monitoring period gross beta particle activity was detected at levels between ND and 12 pCi/L in LVMWD's water supply. The levels detected in the system were below the MCL at all times, but were over the level identified by the US EPA as the MCLG.

The BAT identified to treat radiological contaminants is reverse osmosis (RO). The most effective and economical treatment system is to use RO treatment at select reservoir and surface water connection sites. LVMWD has determined that the cost to install and operate an RO removal system to meet the reservoir and surface water connections in the system in order to meet the PHG levels would be approximately \$14.6 million which includes construction and annual operational costs. This would be an annual cost to each customer of \$667.

#### Uranium

The PHG for uranium is 0.43 pCi/L and the MCL is 20 pCi/L. Uranium is a metallic element which is weakly radioactive and naturally occurring in the environment.

OEHHA determined that the numerical cancer risk for uranium at the PHG level is 1×10<sup>-6</sup>. Exposure to uranium and drinking water may result in toxic effects to the kidney. This constituent has also been shown to cause cancer in laboratory animals such as rats and mice when the animals are exposed at high levels over their lifetime. Constituents that cause cancer in laboratory animals also may increase the risk of cancer in humans who are exposed over long periods of time.

Uranium has been detected at a level up to 2.5 pCi/L in the water supplied to LVMWD's system by MWD. Uranium was detected in the LVMWD's distribution system at a range of ND – 2.5 pCi/L. The levels detected in our system were below the MCL at all times, but were over the PHG limits.

As described above the gross Alpha, the BAT for uranium is reverse osmosis and is estimated at the annual cost of \$667 per customer.

#### **Bromate**

The PHG for bromate is 0.2 ppb. The California MCL is 10 ppb. Bromate is a chemical that is formed when ozone is used to disinfect drinking water and reacts with naturally occurring bromide found in source water.

The category of health risk associated with bromate is that people who drink water containing bromate in excess of the MCL over many years may have an increased risk of cancer. As there is no PHG for bromate, OEHHA has not yet determined the numerical risk at the MCL. However an MCLG of zero has a numerical health risk of zero.

Bromate has been detected at levels up to 11 ppb in the surface water supplied to LVMWD's system.

The BAT for bromate is control of the ozone treatment process to reduce production of bromate. MWD continues to strive to minimize bromate production during the ozonation treatment process.

#### Lead

There is no MCL for lead. Instead the 90th percentile value of all samples collected by LVMWD from household taps cannot exceed an Action Level of 15 ppb for lead. The PHG for lead is 0.2 ppb. Lead may leach into drinking water through LVMWD's and residents' plumbing systems.

The category of health risk for lead is damage to the kidneys or nervous system of humans. The numerical health risk of ingesting drinking water with lead at the PHG is  $3\times10^{-7}$ , or three additional theoretical cancer cases in ten million people drinking two liters of water a day for 70 years.

All of the MWD water samples for lead were less than the PHG. Based on required sampling (samples taken by customers at their household tap), LVMWD's value for the 90th percentile for lead was 7.3 ppb.

LVMWD's water system is in full compliance with the Federal and State Lead Rule. It has been determined, according to the State regulatory requirements that

LVMWD is significantly below the Action Levels for lead. Therefore the system is deemed by CDPH to have "optimized corrosion control" for the system.

In general, optimizing corrosion control is considered to be the BAT to deal with corrosion issues and with any lead findings. LVMWD continues to monitor the water quality parameters that relate to corrosivity such as the pH, hardness, alkalinity, and total dissolved solids.

Since LVMWD is meeting the "optimized corrosion control" requirements it is not necessary or prudent to initiate additional corrosion control treatment as it involves the addition of other chemicals, and additional water quality issues could be raised. Therefore, no estimate of cost has been included.

#### RECOMMENDATIONS FOR FURTHER ACTION

The drinking water quality of Las Virgenes Municipal Water District meets all State of California, Department of Public Health and US EPA drinking water standards set to protect public health. To further reduce the levels of the constituents identified in this report that are already significantly below the health-based Maximum Contaminant Levels established to provide "safe drinking water", additional costly treatment processes would be required. The effectiveness of the treatment processes to provide any significant reductions in constituent levels at these already low values is uncertain. The health protection benefits of these further hypothetical reductions are not at all clear, and may not be quantifiable. The costs associated with incorporating additional treatment processes may be better utilized to provide greater public health protection benefits if spent in other aspects, such as operation, maintenance, and water quality monitoring programs.

### **SUMMARY:**

On May 14, 2013, the Board of Directors, by unanimous vote, authorized the General Manager to take emergency action to replace approximately 1,500 feet of deteriorated 10-inch water main on Calabasas Road following informal bidding procedures in an amount not to exceed \$700,000. Section 2-5-502 of the Las Virgenes Municipal Water District Code establishes that, at each subsequent regular meeting, the Board shall determine by 4/5's vote whether to continue the emergency authorization.

On May 29, 2013, the Board of Directors, by unanimous vote, approved continuation of the emergency authorization.

### **RECOMMENDATION(S):**

Approve continuation of the emergency authorization for the General Manager to replace approximately 1,500 feet of deteriorated 10-inch water main on Calabasas Road following informal bidding procedures in an amount not to exceed \$700,000.

### **FINANCIAL IMPACT:**

The Board of Directors previously authorized the work in an amount not to exceed \$700,000.

### **DISCUSSION:**

Las Virgenes Municipal Water District Code Section 2-5-502 - Emergencies:

(b) "When a meeting of the Board can be commenced in a timely manner to authorize emergency action, by a 4/5's vote, the Board may authorize procurement of good and services without formal bids, informal bids, or requests for proposal. Such authorization shall be based on substantial evidence set forth in the minutes of the meeting that the emergency will not permit delay and action is necessary to respond to the emergency. Until the emergency subsides or the work is complete, at each subsequent regular meeting the Board shall determine by 4/5's vote whether to continue or terminate the authorization for emergency."

Subject: Proposed LVMWD Operating and Capital Budget for Fiscal Year 2013-14

### SUMMARY:

Staff recommends adoption of a \$72.0 million budget for operations and capital improvement projects for Fiscal Year 2013-14. The Board reviewed the preliminary budget at its regular meeting held on May 14, 2013. The Joint Powers Authority (JPA) operating and capital budget was adopted at the regular JPA Board meeting on June 3, 2013.

### **RECOMMENDATION(S):**

Adopt the Proposed LVMWD Operating and Capital Budget for Fiscal Year 2013-14.

### **DISCUSSION:**

For the first time since Fiscal Year 2005-06, the potable water enterprise is expected to achieve a positive net operating income as a result of rate changes approved by the Board in October 2012. The second year of the three-year rate changes take effect on January 1, 2014. The recycled water and sanitation enterprises continue to maintain net operating incomes necessary to meet future requirements.

The Proposed Budget includes major capital projects that have been anticipated for many years and are finally reaching the construction phase. As outlined in the District's Financial Policies, sufficient funds have been set aside to cover these major financial commitments.

The Los Angeles County Department of Public Works sent resolutions to the District for negotiated tax exchanges associated with annexation of territories. Under these negotiated tax exchanges, the District, other special districts and cities in the area give up a portion of their ad valorem tax to the County Lighting Districts for parcels that are within our District and only recently annexing into the Lighting Districts. District Counsel has previously reviewed these resolutions and advised approval. The Board approved negotiated tax exchanges for this purpose beginning in October 2002. The last negotiated tax exchange was approved in March 2012.

STREET LIGHTING DISTRICTS NEGOTIATED TAX EXCHANGE RESOLUTION RESULTING FROM **ANNEXATION OF TERRITORY PETITION NO. 16-411 TO COUNTY LIGHTING MAINTENANCE DISTRICT 1687** 

This letter is to request that the Las Virgenes Municipal Water District, the Las Virgenes Municipal Water Improvement District No. 9, and the Las Virgenes Municipal Water Improvement District U-1 participates in the exchange of ad valorem property tax in conjunction with the annexation of territory known as Petition No. 16-411 to County Lighting Maintenance District 1687. This proposed exchange would provide revenue to County Lighting Maintenance District 1687 to partially fund the operation and maintenance of street lighting services provided within the annexed territory. This territory, whose boundary is shown on the enclosed proposed annexation map, is being processed for the County Board of Supervisors' concurrent approval of the annexation and transfer of ad valorem property tax between the affected taxing agencies and County Lighting Maintenance District 1687.

For new annexations to a County-administered County Lighting Maintenance District, our procedures require us to process the exchange of property tax revenues with all nonexempt taxing agencies. Under Section 99.01 of the California Revenue and Taxation Code, special districts providing new services to an area as a result of a jurisdictional change are entitled to a share of the annual tax increment generated in the area being annexed. County Lighting Maintenance District 1687 meets the definition of a special district under Section 95(m) of the California Revenue and Taxation Code. County Lighting Maintenance District 1687's share of the annual tax increment is to be taken from all of the other local taxing agencies providing services

within the annexed area, with the exception of school entities, which are exempted by law. If a taxing agency involved in the negotiation does not adopt a resolution providing for the exchange of property tax revenue, the Board can determine the exchange of property tax revenue for that taxing agency.

Enclosed are three Joint Resolutions between the County of Los Angeles and the Las Virgenes Municipal Water District, the County of Los Angeles and the Las Virgenes Municipal Water Improvement District No. 9, and the County of Los Angeles and the Las Virgenes Municipal Water Improvement District U-1 approving and accepting the negotiated exchange of property tax revenues resulting from the annexation of the subject territory to County Lighting Maintenance District 1687. Attached to each Joint Resolution is a Property Tax Transfer Resolution Worksheet listing the share of the annual tax increment to be exchanged between the Las Virgenes Municipal Water District, the Las Virgenes Municipal Water Improvement District No. 9, the Las Virgenes Municipal Water Improvement District U-1, other affected taxing agencies, and County Lighting Maintenance District 1687. The tax-sharing ratios listed on the worksheets were calculated using a formula approved by the Auditor-Controller and County Counsel. As shown on the Property Tax Transfer Resolution Worksheet for Petition No. 16-411, Tax Rate Area 08103, the current tax share ratio for the Las Virgenes Municipal Water District is 0.000729362. Out of the Las Virgenes Municipal Water District tax share, the Las Virgenes Municipal Water District would allocate 0.000014151 to County Lighting Maintenance District 1687, with a net share to the Las Virgenes Municipal Water District of 0.000715211, or monetarily speaking, a \$10,000 increment in assessed valuation of a parcel means that the parcel will pay an additional \$100 in property taxes, of which the Las Virgenes Municipal Water District would receive \$0.0715 and County Lighting Maintenance District 1687 would receive \$0.0014.

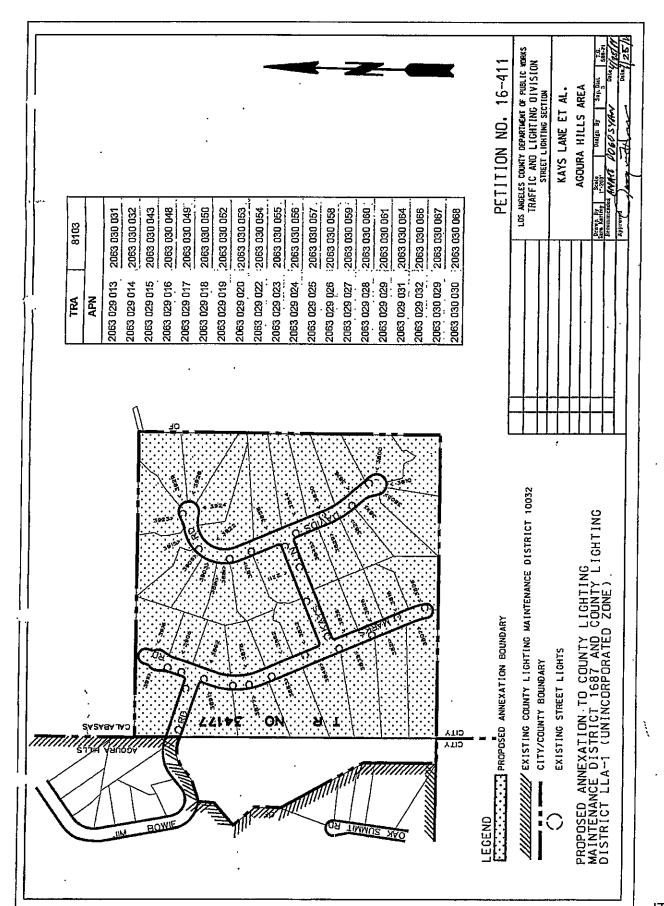

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 99.01 of the California Revenue and Taxation Code, prior to the effective date of any jurisdictional change that will result in a special district providing one or more services to an area where those services have not previously been provided by any local agency, the special district and each local agency that receives an apportionment of property tax revenue from the area must negotiate an exchange of property tax increment generated in the area subject to the jurisdictional change and attributable to those local agencies; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of the County of Los Angeles, acting on behalf of the County Lighting Maintenance District 1687, the County General Fund, the County of Los Angeles Public Library, the County of Los Angeles Road District 3, the Consolidated Fire Protection District of Los Angeles County, the County of Los Angeles Flood Control Drainage Improvement Maintenance District, and the Los Angeles County Flood Control District; the Board of Trustees of the Los Angeles County West Vector Control District; the Board of Directors of the Resource Conservation District of the Santa Monica Mountains; the Board of Directors of the Las Virgenes Municipal Water Improvement District No. 9; and the Board of Directors of the Las Virgenes Municipal Water Improvement District U-1 have determined that the amount of property tax revenue to be exchanged between their respective agencies as a result of the annexation proposal identified as Petition No. 16-411 to County Lighting Maintenance District 1687 is as shown on the attached Property Tax Transfer Resolution Worksheet.

### NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. The negotiated exchange of property tax revenues between the County Lighting Maintenance District 1687, the County General Fund, the County of Los Angeles Public Library, the County of Los Angeles Road District. No. 3, the Consolidated Fire Protection District of Los Angeles County, the County of Los Angeles Flood Control Drainage Improvement Maintenance District, and the Los Angeles County Flood Control District, the Los Angeles County West Vector Control District, the Resource Conservation District of the Santa Monica Mountains, the Las Virgenes Municipal Water District, the Las Virgenes Municipal Water Improvement District U-1 resulting from annexation of Petition No. 16-411 to County Lighting Maintenance District 1687 is approved and accepted.
- 2. For fiscal years commencing on or after July 1, 2013, or the July 1 after the effective date of this jurisdictional change, whichever is later, the property tax revenue increment generated from the area within Petition No. 16-411, Tax Rate Area 08103, shall be allocated to the affected agencies as indicated on the Property Tax Transfer Resolution Worksheet.
- 3. No transfer of property tax revenues other than those specified in Paragraph 2 shall be made as a result of annexation of Petition No. 16-411.
- 4. If at any time after the effective date of this resolution the calculations used herein to determine initial property tax transfers or the data used to perform those calculations are found to be incorrect, thus producing an improper or inaccurate property tax transfer, the property tax transfer shall be recalculated and the corrected transfer shall be implemented for the next fiscal year, and any amounts of property tax received in excess of that, which is proper shall be refunded to the appropriate agency.

#### SUMMARY:

At the March 26, 2013 Board meeting, an inconsistency was pointed out related to the General Manager's level of authority to approve change orders for works of improvement. Staff recommended temporarily applying the more stringent portions of both the LVMWD Code and Change Order Policy until a recommendation for the appropriate levels of approval could be presented to the Board for approval. The attached resolution provides the recommended level of change order approval for the General Manager.

# **RECOMMENDATION(S):**

Pass, approve and adopt Resolution No. 06-13-2440.

RESOLUTION NO. 06-13-2440: A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF LAS VIRGENES MUNICIPAL WATER DISTRICT AMENDING RESOLUTION 7-90-2046 (ADMINISTRATIVE CODE) AS IT RELATES TO CHANGE FOR CONTRACTS

(Reference is hereby made to Resolution No. 06-13-2440 on file in the District's Resolution Book and by this reference the same are incorporated and made a part of hereof.)

#### **FINANCIAL IMPACT:**

There is no financial impact associated with this action.

#### **DISCUSSION:**

Staff reviewed the General Manager's approval levels for construction contract change orders and identified an inconsistency between a long-standing Change Order Policy (Policy) approved by the Board and the Las Virgenes Municipal Water District Code (Code).

On February 26, 1990, the Board approved a Policy that had been successfully utilized for the Tapia Expansion III Project and Westlake Filter Plant Project. The Policy provides for the General Manager to administratively approve change orders up to \$50,000, with those less than \$10,000 presented to the Board for information and those more than \$10,000 but less than \$50,000 submitted to the Board for ratification. For change orders of more than \$50,000, the Policy requires prior approval by the Board. However, Section 2-3.107 of the Code was not updated to incorporate the approved Policy and continues to reflect that the General Manager is only delegated authority to approve public works change orders up to \$25,000.

The recommended levels of approval are based on the value of the contract or duration of time extensions. Staff believes these levels of approval will provide the necessary latitude needed to support the timely completion of construction projects and avoid delay that can result in additional costs. Any change order, regardless of the contract value, must be within the scope of the project approved by the Board and shall not exceed the budget approved by the Board. Change orders approved by the General Manager will be reported as soon as possible to the Board as an informational item.

For contracts less than or equal to \$1,000,000, the General Manager would be authorized to approve any single change order that does not exceed \$50,000 and provided that the cumulative changes orders for a single project do not exceed \$100,000.

For contracts greater than \$1,000,000, the General Manager would be authorized to approve any single change that does not exceed 5% of the original amount awarded by the Board and provided that the cumulative changes orders for a single project do not exceed 10% of the original amount awarded by the Board.

For contracts, regardless of the amount, the General Manager may approve time extensions up to 25% of the original contract duration. The General Manager may approve deductive change orders, but the deductive change order(s) shall not be applied offset the above amounts.

# BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF LAS VIRGENES MUNICIPAL WATER DISTRICT as follows:

# 1. Purpose.

This resolution amends Resolution 7-90-2046 (Administrative Code) to authorize the General Manager to approve contract change orders with specified parameters.

#### 2. Amendment.

Section 2-3.107 of Resolution 7-90-2046 (Administrative Code) is amended and reenacted to read as follows:

# "2-3.107 AGREEMENT AND AUTHORIZATIONS

- (a) There is hereby delegated to the General Manager the power to bind this District by contract, pursuant to the provisions of this Code, relating to the following subject matters:
  - (1) Limited Service
  - (2) Pressure Limits
  - (3) Main Extension
  - (4) Temporary Service
  - (5) Extraterritorial Service
  - (6) Interties with other water utilities or suppliers
- (7) Recycled Water Improvement (to a maximum of \$25,000 per agreement)
  - (8) Deposit Agreements
- (b) The General Manager may approve changes to contracts for works of improvement awarded by the board ("change orders") provided the changed work is within the scope of the project approved by the board, the cost of the changed work does not exceed the budget for the work approved by the board, and:
  - (1) For contracts less than or equal to \$1,000,000:
    - a. a single change order does not exceed \$50,000;
  - b. the total of all change orders do not exceed \$100,000;

- (2) For contracts greater than \$1,000,000:
- a. a single change order does not exceed 5% of the original amount awarded by the board;
- b. the total of all change orders do not exceed 10% of the original amount awarded by the board; and
  - (3) For contracts regardless of amount:
- a. time extension up to 25% of the time stated in the contract; and
- b. a deduction change order is within the foregoing parameters but a deduction change order shall not offset the above amounts.
- (c) The General Manager shall file a written notice with the clerk of the board when a change order is approved by the General Manager pursuant to this section. The clerk shall distribute to the board as an information item at the next board meeting.
- (d) Except as provided herein, the board shall approve changes to contracts for works of improvement."

#### 3. Other.

Except as provided herein, Resolution No. 7-90-2046 (Administrative Code) is reaffirmed and readopted.

#### **SUMMARY:**

RESOLUTION NO. 06-13-2441: A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF LAS VIRGENES MUNICIPAL WATER DISTRICT AMENDING RESOLUTION 7-90-2046 (ADMINISTRATIVE CODE) AS IT RELATES TO INVESTMENT POLICY

(Reference is hereby made to Resolution No. 06-13-2441 on file in the District's Resolution Book and by this reference the same are incorporated and made a part of hereof.)

# **DISCUSSION:**

The resolution contains the same changes reviewed by the Board on May 14th. Following is a summary of the changes:

- Allow the Treasurer to waive the first \$250,000 of collateral security without risk of losing principal due to the increase of the FDIC insurance coverage limit from \$100,000 to \$250,000.
- Eliminate a provision that favors financial institutions that invest in District bonds or contribute service or significant assistance to the District.
- Clarify that there is no limit stipulated in the California Government Code for the amount of the investment portfolio that may be invested in U.S. Treasury Notes and federal agency and municipal bonds.
- Eliminate FDIC Guarantee Bank Notes and Certificates of Deposit Account Registry Service, which have been discontinued.
- Recognize that the State no longer requires the Investment Policy be reviewed in January and, therefore, review of the Investment Policy will be completed from time-to-time, as necessary.

The District's Legal Counsel reviewed the proposed changes to the Investment Policy and prepared the resolution for the Board's approval.

# BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF LAS VIRGENES MUNICIPAL WATER DISTRICT as follows:

# 1. Purpose.

This resolution amends Resolution 7-90-2046 (Administrative Code) by revising the permitted investments for District money.

#### 2. Amendment.

Section 2-5.603 of Resolution 7-90-2046 is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

# "2-5.603 PRUDENT PERSON

As in investment standard, any investment shall be made as if it is one that would be purchased by a prudent person using the same discretion and intelligence that a person would use in managing his own affairs and certainly not for speculation."

#### 3. Amendment.

Section 2-5-604 of Resolution 7-90-2046 is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

# "2-5.604 CRITERIA FOR INVESTMENT

The following criteria will be used in evaluating financial institutions which are eligible for deposits:

- (a) Must be federally insured and have total assets of at least \$10 billion and a net worth ratio of a least three percent.
- (b) Collateral shall be deposited in accordance with the Government Code, consisting of one of the following:
- (1) Collateral comprised of mortgages/trust deeds must be provided which at all times is in an amount in value at least fifty percent in excess of the amount deposited.
- (2) Collateral comprised of eligible securities other than mortgages/trust deeds must be provided which at all times is in an amount in value at least ten percent in excess of the amount deposited.
- (c) The Treasurer may waive the first \$250,000 of collateral security if the institution is insured pursuant to Federal law."

#### 4. Amendment.

Section 2-5-607 of Resolution 7-90-2046 is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

#### "2-5.607 AUTHORIZED INVESTMENTS

- (a) The following investments are authorized:
- (1) United States Treasury Bills, Bonds and Notes, or those mutual funds for which the full faith and credit of the United States is pledged for payment of principal and interest. There is no limit to the amount of the investment portfolio that may be invested in U. S. Treasury Notes.
- (2) Obligations issued by the United States Government Agencies, such as the Government National Mortgage Association (GNMA), the Federal Farm Credit Bank System (FFCB), the Federal Home Loan Bank Board (FHLB), the Federal National Mortgage Association (FNMA), and the Student Loan Marketing Association (SLMA), and mutual funds that consist of these obligations. There is no limit to the amount of the investment portfolio that may be invested in Federal Agencies.
- (3) Time deposits, non-negotiable and collateralized in accordance with the Government Code in those U.S. banks and savings and loan associations that meet the requirements as evaluated by a nationally recognized statistical rating organization (NSRO) as designated by the Securities and Exchange Commission, for the qualitative and quantitative analysis of financial institutions. The issuer firm should have been in existence for at least five years. The District may waive the first \$100,000 of collateral security for such deposits if the institution is insured pursuant to federal law. To secure such deposits, an institution shall maintain in the collateral pool securities having a market value of at least 10% in excess of the total amount deposited. Real estate mortgages may not be accepted as collateral. The maximum term for deposits shall be one year. In general, the issuer must have a minimum tier one risk-based capital ratio of 6% as determined by the FDIC and their operation must have been profitable during their last reporting period. No more than 25% of the market value of the portfolio may be vested in time deposits.
- Repurchase agreements with banks and dealers with which the District has entered into a master repurchase contract that specifies terms and conditions of repurchase agreements. The transactions shall be limited to primary dealers and the top twenty-five U.S. banking institutions according to asset size. The maturity of repurchase agreements shall not exceed thirty days. The market value of the securities used as collateral for repurchase agreements shall be monitored daily by the investment staff and will not be allowed to fall below 100% of the value of the repurchase agreement. In order to conform with provisions of the Federal Bankruptcy Code, which provides for the liquidation of securities held as collateral for repurchase agreements, the only securities acceptable as collateral shall be certificates of deposit, eligible banker's acceptances, or securities that are either direct obligations of, or that are fully guaranteed as to principal and interest by the United States or any agency of the United States. A perfected security interest shall always be maintained in the securities, subject to a repurchase agreement. No more than 10% of the market value of the portfolio may be invested in reverse repurchase agreements.
- (5) Local Agency Investment Fund (LAIF) established by the State Treasurer for the benefit of local agencies up to the maximum amount permitted by law.
- (6) Local government investment pools or mutual funds in private sector that adhere to the Government Code parameters for eligible investments. These are similar to LAIF in function and practice but are not administered through the state.
- (7) Bonds, notes issued by local agencies, state of California, and any of the other 49 United States, including bonds payable solely out of the revenues from a

revenue-producing property owned, controlled, or operated by the local agency, or by a department, board, agency, or authority of the local agency, such as Las Virgenes Municipal Water District. The maturity of such bonds or notes should not exceed five years from the date of purchase. The long-term ratings of such bonds should have at least AA- by Standard and Poor's (S&P) or Aa3 by Moody's, or the short-term ratings should have at least A-1 by S&P, and P-1 by Moody's. There is no limit to the amount of the investment portfolio that may be invested in municipal bonds.

(b) Ineligible investments include, but are not limited to, common stocks and corporate bonds, inverse floaters, range notes, interest-only strips that are derived from a pool of mortgages and mutual funds. The use of derivatives, options, futures or buying on margin is also specifically prohibited. Securities that could result in zero interest accrual if held to maturity are ineligible. Security transactions shall be conducted on delivery-versus-payment basis. Securities purchased or acquired by the District shall be held in safekeeping by a third party only pursuant to a custodial agreement as required by Government Code §53601."

#### 5. Amendment.

Section 2-5-610 of Resolution 7-90-2046 is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

# "2-5.610 REVIEW AND REVISION

From time-to-time, the board shall review the investment policy, including the delegation of authority to invest funds, to sell or exchange securities, or to add new investment instruments in the future."

# 6. Other.

Except as provided herein, Resolution No. 7-90-2046 is reaffirmed and readopted.
