SUMMARY

For the second time in 15 years, the Compost Reactor Building will be taken out of service in order to perform inspections of building structural materials, building maintenance and repainting of the agitators. In order to perform the work, staff solicited three quotes from biosolids land application or compost contractors. The quotes submitted for hauling and land application or composting of the biosolids are as follows:

Synagro

Offsite biosolids cake hauling will begin on July 1, 2009, and continue until the inspections and maintenance work are complete, expected to be 90 days. In addition, Synagro will provide a yard goat for District use at a cost of \$2500 for 90 days.

RECOMMENDATION

• Authorize the General Manager to issue a purchase order to Synagro for offsite disposal of biosolids in the amount of \$41.75 per wet ton including \$2,500 for rental of the yard goat.

<u>SUMMARY</u>

At the August 14, 2007 meeting, the Board approved Dudek Engineering and Environmental (Dudek) to prepare the plans and specifications for the above project for engineering services to design the 24" REW pipeline from Tapia Water Reclamation Facility to Mulholland Hwy., and to provide engineering support services during construction. A mitigated negative declaration had been previously completed and approved by the Board at the March 27, 2007 meeting. District staff followed this by filing a Notice of Determination with the State Office of Planning and Research and the County of Los Angeles Recorder. The District also received a waiver from the California Coastal Commission to proceed with this project, and a Permit to Enter from California State Parks has been obtained. A call for bids is appropriate at this time. The construction consists of approximately 8,900 feet of steel or plastic pipes through Tapia State Park and along Las Virgenes Road to Mulholland Highway.

Consultants with specialized disciplines are also needed during the pipe construction. These include an archeologist to document what items of cultural significance may be unearthed during construction; a Native American (Chumash) monitor to identify such cultural items; a geotechnical firm to assist with soils testing, and an arborist who will document the existing healthy trees and plants that may be impacted during construction, and to give guidance on construction methods to ensure such trees and plants are protected while pipe is being installed. Las Virgenes Municipal Water District and Triunfo Sanitation District Joint Powers Authority approved funding for this matter in the Joint Powers Authority Budget. This recommendation is before the LVMWD Board of Directors for action, as administering agent, as authorized under the Joint Powers Authority Agreement.

SUMMARY

Change Order #5 was administratively approved for the Tapia BNR Phase I Project on June 8, 2009. This change order addresses three issues:

- 1. The District requested that Spiess provide a quotation to replace the aeration lines and drop legs in the feeder channels in BNR basins #3 and #4. After approximately 30 years, the existing galvanized steel piping is in need of replacement due to corrosion. These aeration lines are used to keep the mixed liquor in suspension and prevent it from attaining septic conditions in the feeder channels. Channel #3 and channel #4 each have approximately 160 feet of galvanized std. steel piping. There are 31 drop legs in channel #3 and 29 in channel #4. The Contractor will supply and install the piping, valves and pipe supports and the District will supply the diffusers. The total cost for this work is \$33,962.00.
- 2. The District requested a quotation from Spiess to weld tabs on the forty eight swing-arm diffusers in the aeration basins to mount new sacrificial anodes. These new anodes were recommended by the District's corrosion consultant, Harper and Associates. The scope of work includes welding new tabs on each swing-arm and then re-coating the surface. The anodes will be mounted to the tabs by others. The total cost for this work is \$3,818.00.
- 3. As a part of the Tapia BNR Phase I Contract, a control panel (CP-500) is to be demolished. Designated wires within the panel were called out to be re-routed. One set of motor control/feeder wires was not called out to be re-routed in the Contract. These wires need to be re-routed to keep the transfer pump they power in operation. The proposed cost for this work is \$4,609.52.

The total cost for this change order is \$42,389.52. The costs for this change order were reviewed by District staff and consultants and deemed acceptable.

On April 6, 2009 the JPA approved a Request for Proposals (RFP) for the provision of engineering services to evaluate the ceiling structure in the reactor building at the Rancho Las Virgenes Compost Facility and to provide plans and specifications for the construction of necessary repairs. Serious corrosion has occurred on the ceiling structure in the "loading area" of the reactor building. In 2006, SGH structural engineers issued a letter report after evaluating the condition of the ceiling structure in the "loading area." In this report, it was determined that the trusses in the structure could not be properly recoated and it was recommended that the trusses be replaced with wide flange steel beams.

To properly evaluate the condition of the ceiling structure and develop plans and specifications for repair in the reactor building, an RFP was issued to qualified structural engineering firms. RFP's were sent to five consultant structural engineering firms, followed by an optional field tour of the facility. Two firms submitted proposals, which were reviewed by District staff.

After evaluation of the proposals, Tectonics was selected as the top candidate for several reasons. Their proposal was technically complete, demonstrated a thorough understanding of the project, and adequately addressed all the issues of the RFP. Additionally, Tectonics has work experience in similar facilities, including previous work in the reactor building.

RECOMMENDATION

 Accept the proposal from Tectonics to provide engineering services for design of the Rancho Las Virgenes Compost Reactor Building Ceiling Repair in an amount not to exceed \$39,319.

LVMWD Budget for FY09/10

SUMMARY

Staff has proposed a \$60.3 million budget for operations and capital improvement projects for FY09/10. The Board reviewed the preliminary budget at the regular meeting held on April 28, 2009. The Joint Powers Authority operating and capital budgets will be considered for adoption at the regular JPA meeting on July 6, 2009.

Staff requests that the Board approve the budget and direct staff to proceed with the Proposition 218 required notice to increase potable water rates to pass through higher than anticipated MWD wholesale water rate increases. Please note that the Sanitation rate increase of 7.8% approved for July 1, 2009 is not included in the budget. Analysis of the current working capital compared to the financial model shows the rate increase is not necessary at this time due to savings in capital project expenditures.

RECOMMENDATION

- Adopt the proposed budget for FY09/10, and
- Direct staff and district counsel to prepare the appropriate ordinances for water and sanitation rate changes, and
- Direct staff to proceed with the preparation of the Proposition 218 notice to pass through unanticipated wholesale water rate increases from MWD.

DISCUSSION

The financial model developed during the rate study approved in 2007 has proven very useful in determining whether the District is meeting its working capital and reserve goals annually, as defined in the District's Adopted Financial Policies. Based upon expenses and revenues, year to date, the Recycled Water operating and replacement fund working capital is on target to meet its reserve goals. The Sanitation operating fund working capital is better than anticipated due to lower than expected costs in the BNR capital project. Therefore staff recommends that the July 1, 2009 revenue increase of 7.8% (\$8.00 for two months) be suspended at this time, and the last transfer of net income from Recycled Water Operations to Sanitation Operations be made in June 2009.

The financial plan for Potable Water Operations was to gradually decrease the working capital in potable water as the Sanitation Operations working capital reaches its financial target. The potable water working capital has decreased slower than expected due to larger volume sales during the past two dry years.

Two events in the new budget year will make the decrease in working capital accelerate at an alarming rate. First, the allocated amount of water from MWD is 20% less than the water sold last year. The District has notified customers of their potable water allocation for FY09/10 and the overuse surcharge which will be levied. However, there is a possibility that the surcharge may not cover the penalties that could be assessed by MWD. If, in the best case scenario, customers all stay within their allotments, the District will still have greater expenses than revenues as the District maintains the same revenue rates as approved in 2007, and the resulting revenue shortage will be covered by the Rate Stabilization Reserve, which was created for just this purpose.

The second event that will cause the rapid decline of potable water working capital is that the MWD's tier one wholesale water rate will increase by 21% on September 1, 2009. MWD previously raised rates by 14% in January 2009. The financial model had anticipated MWD would raise rates by 10% on January 1, 2009 and again on January 1, 2010, and the amount had seemed a reasonable prediction until April 2009, when MWD announced its revised projections and approved rate increases for the next two years. MWD has also advised that there will be another rate increase in January 2011 of what is currently expected to be 21.5%. Since our financial model had not anticipated these higher rates, and because we still have two more years of approved rate increases that will not cover the increased rates from MWD, staff recommends that the unanticipated wholesale water rate increase from MWD be passed through to customers beginning January 1, 2010, and that customers be notified that the unanticipated portion of the January 1, 2011 (that is, the amount over and above what was anticipated for MWD increases in the five-year financial model) will also be passed along in 2011.

Staff is determining how the increase in wholesale water rates can be passed along to the customers while maintaining the same relationship between tiers. Staff recommends that the pass-through should be no earlier than January 1, 2010 because customers will still be coming to terms with living within the potable water allotment and we do not want to cloud the financial picture to the customer during the first three billing cycles under the allotment.

If the pass-through is approved, the additional revenue would be approximately \$650,000, which will not cover the \$5.9 million shortfall between current anticipated potable water revenues (\$21.9 million) and budgeted expenses (\$27.8 million), but this approach appears to be in line with the spirit of AB 3030.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF LAS VIRGENES MUNICIPAL WATER DISTRICT AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 11-86-161 (LAS VIRGENES CODE) AS IT RELATES TO WATER CONSERVATION INCENTIVES

1. Purpose.

Customers are encouraged to make the most efficient use of the potable and recycled water supplies. The district may by resolution offer financial and other incentives to customers who replace high volume water use equipment, appliances and devices with low volume water use equipment, appliances and devices."

Records and Library Management Services - Award

SUMMARY

On September 23, 2008, the Board of Directors authorized the General Manager to execute an Agreement for Professional Services with Ictus Consulting, LLC in an amount not to exceed \$30,000 for the period of September 24, 2008 through June 30, 2009.

During May and June 2008 and again in March 2009, several inquiries were made through utilization of local agency contacts to determine how records management and library services were performed. Through this process Ictus Consulting, LLC was identified as the only company that provides weekly scheduled records management and information management services, including the library.

During the initial contract period, which ends June 30, 2009, Ictus Consulting, LLC has performed its records management and library services in a professional, knowledgeable and responsive manner. Cynthia Nunes and Antoinette Mann, who provide weekly consulting services, have familiarized themselves with regard to the District's administrative policies, existing library and records management systems.

Ictus Consulting LLC provided written confirmation of their rate schedule for fiscal year 2009-10, during which their consulting rates are unchanged from fiscal year 2008-09.

RECOMMENDATION

Approve the Agreement for Professional Services with lctus Consulting, LLC with five (5) one-year contract renewal options.

AGREEMENT FOR PROFESSIONAL SERVICES

ICTUS CONSULTING, LLC

As of <u>June 23, 2009</u>, **Las Virgenes Municipal Water District**, hereinafter "DISTRICT", and **Ictus Consulting**, **LLC**, hereinafter "CONSULTANT", agree as follows:

SECTION 1. PURPOSES

DISTRICT proposes to engage CONSULTANT to perform **Records**, **Information and Library Management Services** for the DISTRICT. The professional services were solicited pursuant to § 2-5.504 of the Administrative Code.

SECTION 2. SCOPE OF SERVICES

CONSULTANT shall provide, as needed, oversight of records retention and disposal, offsite records storage, departmental records review, file classification structure updates; and maintenance of the records retention schedule and district library.

SECTION 3. COMPENSATION

- (a) Compensation shall be made on a time and material basis and shall include all reimbursement, not to exceed \$42,000 for CONSULTANT'S expenses necessary for completion of the work. Compensation is based upon the Ictus Consulting, LLC rate schedule dated May 12, 2009 attached as **Exhibit "A"**. No additional compensation or expense reimbursement shall be paid by DISTRICT without express written consent by DISTRICT prior to the performance of work or the accrual of the expense.
- (b) CONSULTANT shall submit monthly billings stating services performed and the amount due for services rendered. Monthly billings shall include position, hourly rate, hours worked, expenses, other direct costs, and total billing to date. The billing shall be reviewed by DISTRICT and upon determination that such billing reflects the actual work satisfactorily performed, payment shall be authorized therefore. DISTRICT will notify CONSULTANT of any questions regarding charges on the invoices within 14

days (2 weeks) of receipt of the invoice. Any charges not questioned within 14 days (2 weeks) of receipt of the invoice shall be considered satisfactory to the DISTRICT and invoice shall be due as provided for herein. Payment shall be made to CONSULTANT through the DISTRICT'S normal disbursement procedure as promptly as is practical, but in no event more than thirty (30) days after receipt of invoice, provided CONSULTANT is not in breach of its obligations under this AGREEMENT.

SECTION 4. TIME FOR PERFORMANCE

Performance under this contract shall commence upon notification of the CONSULTANT by the DISTRICT. The CONSULTANT shall complete the work on or before June 30, 2010.

SECTION 5. INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR

CONSULTANT is and shall be acting at all times as an independent contractor and not an employee of the DISTRICT. CONSULTANT shall secure at CONSULTANT'S expense and be responsible for any and all payment of Income Taxes, Social Security Taxes, State Disability Insurance, Unemployment Compensation, and other payroll deductions for CONSULTANT and its officers, agents, and employees, and all business licenses, which are required in connection with the services to be performed.

SECTION 6. INDEMNIFICATION

CONSULTANT shall save and hold harmless DISTRICT, its elected and appointed boards, officers, agents, and employees, and consulting engineers, from and against any and all costs, liabilities, expenses or damages, including attorney's fees, in proportion and to the extent arising out of any willful misconduct or negligent act or omission to act, including negligent acts of omission, by CONSULTANT, its officers, agents, or employees arising during the performance of this AGREEMENT.

SECTION 7. INSURANCE

CONSULTANT shall obtain and maintain during the life of this AGREEMENT the following insurance coverage:

- (a) Comprehensive general liability in the amount of one million dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence and two million dollars (\$2,000,000) aggregate. A Special Insurance Endorsement naming DISTRICT, its elected, appointed boards, officers, agents, and employees as additional insured shall be provided on a form approved by DISTRICT Counsel.
- (b) Automobile liability in the amount of one million dollars (\$1,000,000) combined single limits per claim and aggregate for hired vehicles and non-owned vehicles.
- (c) Professional liability (errors and omissions) in the amount of one million dollars (\$1,000,000) shall be provided to DISTRICT on a claims made basis.
- (d) CONSULTANT shall obtain and maintain, during the life of this AGREEMENT, Worker's Compensation Insurance in the statutory amount.

SECTION 8. TERMINATION OF AGREEMENT

Either party may terminate this AGREEMENT at any time by giving the other party thirty (30) days written notice. CONSULTANT is entitled to payment for services rendered to date for work that is judged satisfactory to DISTRICT.

SECTION 9. COMPLIANCE WITH LAWS

The parties shall be bound by applicable federal, state, and local laws, ordinances, regulations, and directives as they pertain to the performance of this AGREEMENT.

SECTION 10. CONFIDENTIALITY

In the conduct of project work activities CONSULTANT may, from time to time, have access to DISTRICT'S confidential and proprietary information, methodologies and documentation (collectively referred to as "Confidential Information"). CONSULTANT agrees that Confidential Information will be used solely for the performance of consulting services as assigned, and CONSULTANT agrees to maintain, in perpetuity, the confidential nature of any and all

Confidential Information received or used pursuant to all statutory laws relating to privacy and confidentiality as now in existence or as hereafter amended or changed. CONSULTANT further agrees not to disclose any Confidential Information, at any time, to any individual, third party, organization or any other entity without DISTRICT'S written permission. If requested by DISTRICT, CONSULTANT is required to return to DISTRICT, all materials constituting Confidential Information, and destroy electronically stored Confidential Information, without retaining any copies.

SECTION 11. EQUAL OPPORTUNITY EMPLOYER

- CONSULTANT will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for (a) employment because of race, color, religion, creed, national origin, ancestry, physical handicap, medical condition, age, marital status, or sex. CONSULTANT shall ensure applicants are employed, and employees will be treated during employment without regard to their race, color, religion, creed, national origin, ancestry, physical handicap, medical condition, age, marital status, or sex. Such actions shall include, but not be following: employment, upgrading, limited to the demotion, or transfer; recruitment or recruitment advertising; layoff or termination, rates of pay or other forms of compensation; and selection for training. CONSULTANT shall post in conspicuous places, available to employees and applicants for employment, notices to be provided setting forth the provisions of this non-discrimination clause.
- (b) In all solicitations or advertisements for employees, CONSULTANT will state qualified applicants will receive consideration for employment without regard to race, color, religion, creed, national origin, ancestry, physical handicap, medical condition, age, marital status, or sex.

SECTION 12. OWNERSHIP OF DOCUMENTS, DATA AND RIGHTS

(a) All documents, drawings, reports, and other tangible products, whether completed or not, and computations, databases, computer models and other materials prepared by CONSULTANT for use solely on this contract and prepared at the expense of the

DISTRICT shall become the property of the DISTRICT upon payment by DISTRICT. CONSULTANT retains rights to its proprietary material, identified and disclosed as such to the DISTRICT, including, but not limited to, patentable concepts or copyrightable materials.

(b) Documents, including drawings and specifications, prepared by CONSULTANT pursuant to this AGREEMENT are not intended or represented to be suitable for reuse by DISTRICT or others. Use of completed documents for other projects or any use of uncompleted documents without specific written authorization from CONSULTANT is at DISTRICT'S sole risk.

SECTION 13. ASSIGNMENT AND SUBCONTRACTING

CONSULTANT shall not assign or subcontract any portion of the services contained in the Scope of Services without express written approval of DISTRICT.

SECTION 14. EFFECTIVE DATE AND PERIOD OF SERVICES

- (a) The effective date of this AGREEMENT is the date signed on behalf of the DISTRICT. Period in which services are to be rendered shall commence on effective date and continue through June 30, 2010.
- (b) This agreement may be extended for up to five (5) additional one-year terms, through BOARD authorized letter agreement by CONSULTANT and DISTRICT upon mutually agreeable terms and compensation.

SECTION 15. MISCELLANEOUS

(a) If any changes are made in the work performed hereunder, by DISTRICT or persons other than CONSULTANT, any and all liability arising out of such changes is waived against CONSULTANT, and DISTRICT assumes full responsibility for such changes unless DISTRICT has given CONSULTANT prior notice and has received from

CONSULTANT written consent for such changes.

- (b) In the performance of its professional services, CONSULTANT will use that degree of care and skill ordinarily exercised under similar conditions in similar localities, and no other warranties, express or implied, are made or intended in any of CONSULTANT'S proposals, contracts or reports. DISTRICT hereby holds harmless and agrees to indemnify CONSULTANT, its directors, officers, employees and agents against all loss, cost of damage, or liability, including costs of defense, arising out of the intentionally wrongful or negligent acts or omissions of DISTRICT or its employees in connection with the work covered by this AGREEMENT.
- (c) In providing its services hereunder, CONSULTANT shall not be responsible for identification, handling, containment, abatement, or in any other respect, for any asbestos or hazardous material if such is present in connection with the project. If DISTRICT becomes aware of the presence of asbestos or hazardous material at the job site, DISTRICT shall be responsible for complying with applicable federal and state rules and regulations, and shall immediately notify CONSULTANT, who shall then be entitled to cease services that may be affected by such presence, without liability to CONSULTANT arising therefrom.
- (d) DISTRICT agrees to indemnify and defend CONSULTANT, its consultants, agents, directors, officers and employees from all claims, damages, losses and expenses, including but not limited to attorney's fees and court and arbitration costs (collectively "the Liabilities"), which Liabilities are related to hazardous materials and/or asbestos activities and arise out of the performance of the work by CONSULTANT or others, regardless of any action or omission on the part of CONSULTANT or anyone for whom CONSULTANT is legally liable.
- (e) Services provided under this AGREEMENT are for the exclusive use of DISTRICT.

- (f) Should litigation be necessary to enforce any term or provision of this AGREEMENT, or to collect any portion of the amount payable under this AGREEMENT, then all litigation and collection expenses, witness fees and court costs, and attorneys' fees shall be paid to the prevailing party.
- (g) Should any provision herein be found or deemed to be invalid, this AGREEMENT shall be construed as not containing such provision, and all other provisions which are otherwise lawful shall remain in full force and effect, and to this end the provisions of this AGREEMENT are declared severable.
