SUMMARY:

On July 23, 2009, the District received a claim from Frances Bateman of Calabasas for \$1,303.00. Bateman alleges a district-owned and operated main ruptured on August 27, 2008, near the Bateman residence, releasing water in the yard that washed away soil and grout. Bateman also alleges that flooding and the district's personnel conducting repair, damaged Bateman's landscaping and sprinklers. The claim is for the cost of repair and replacement.

Staff responded to the call in August 2008, shutting down the main and performing repairs to the ruptured pipe. This was accomplished by removing the sidewalk panel rather than excavating Bateman's property. Backfill and concrete replacement was completed with the next few days, along with cleanup of the area. At the time, staff found no signs of sinkholes, damaged sprinklers or damaged landscaping. Some damage to the grout may have occurred, but Bateman's driveway contained pre-existing cracks and separations that were unrelated to the rupture. Staff took pictures of the property when repairs were made, as they are required to do, and the pictures do not show the damage indicated by the claim.

In response to this claim, staff visited the site on July 27, 2009 for a follow-up survey of the property. Staff compared the items on the invoices submitted with the claim with the plants on the property that was allegedly damaged and did not find a match. Also, the invoice included costs for 50 square feet of sod, but Bateman's front yard, adjacent to the incident site, is significantly smaller than 50 square feet. Staff concluded that the claim is not supported by the evidence.

District Counsel has reviewed this claim and recommends that the claim be denied.

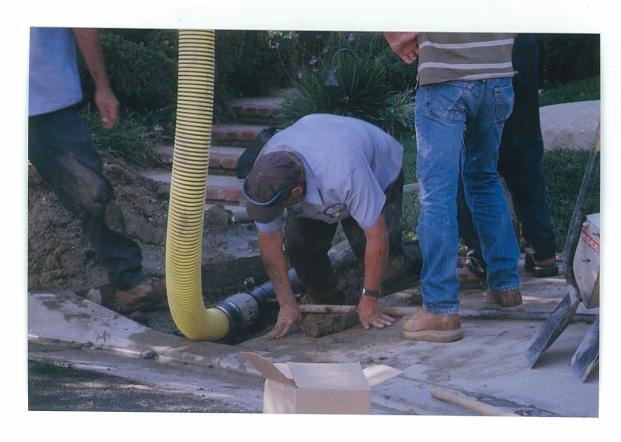

Subject: AMI Leak Detection Project - Federal Co-Funding (USBR/CALFED)

SUMMARY:

The CALFED Water Use Efficiency grant program is administered by the US Bureau of Reclamation (USBR) to accelerate the implementation of cost-effective actions to conserve and recycle water in California. In light of the current water shortage emergency, the USBR has given early notice of pending funding to this year's awardees, including \$79,722 in anticipated funding to the District to co-fund a leak detection and response pilot project. This project will adapt the District's new Automatic Meter Reading (AMR) equipment to automatically monitor daily water use in a large neighborhood in Chatsworth and provide residents there with rapid alerts of leaks and inefficient water use (e.g. irrigation during prohibited hours, rain, etc.).

One of the project goals is to complete the system's main features during the current water shortage emergency, with project start-up beginning this October to come on-line before next year's summer season high demand. To expedite the grant administrative start-up, staff is requesting authorization for the General Manager to accept the grant on behalf of the District when the USBR finalizes the project cooperative agreement later this summer.

RECOMMENDATION(S):

Authorize the General Manager to sign and execute a cooperative agreement with the US Bureau of Reclamation to receive federal co-funding for the District's Advanced Metering Infrastructure (AMI) pilot project.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

A condition of acceptance for this federal grant is \$79,722 in matching District funds (50%) for the purchase and installation of AMI equipment and in-kind services (staff labor). Improvements to the metering infrastructure resulting from this project will be considered during the AMR/AMI Study (CIP Project #10438) planned for the current fiscal year. Staff is preparing a Request for Proposal (RFP) to select a consultant who will provide an implementation strategy for a District-wide AMR/AMI system, taking into account investments made to date.

DISCUSSION:

The primary objective of the District's Automatic Meter Reading (AMR) equipment is to reduce the time and cost of manually reading water meters every two months to accurately bill customers for the water they use, particularly along difficult routes or remote locations. However, AMR equipment also provides an opportunity to monitor water use on a daily or even hourly timestep, and to identify unusually high water use by an automated statistical analysis of current use in relation to prior use. Other existing District information systems are capable of generating email and/or phone alerts for District customers, and can be combined with AMR to create a proactive, communication system capable of providing near real-time leak and high use alerts for District customers. The adaptation of AMR-based billing systems for water conservation, energy conservation and other uses has caught the attention of water providers nationwide, and AMR-BA

manufacturers and vendors are quickly improving the functionality of AMR equipment with this market in mind. However, to date such systems - commonly referred to as Advanced Metering Infrastructure, or AMI - require substantial time and effort to adapt existing AMR equipment to this purpose. An AMI system has obvious potential during a water shortage emergency, but as for all new information systems it must be weighed against the cost to develop and implement the system.

To help finance development of an AMI system, staff recently applied for federal co-funding through the CALFED Water Use Efficiency program (WUE), administered by the USBR[1]. On July 21st USBR notified the District that its AMI pilot would be one of the seven recipients of WUE funds for the 2009-10 CALFED funding cycle. In light of the current statewide water shortage emergency, the USBR took the unusual step of notifying the winning applicants as soon as possible, in advance of drafting the inter-agency cooperative agreements for each project (attached). Time is of the essence for this project if we wish to develop this pilot system before the onset of high use weather next summer, because our experience with AMR to date even for the limited application of billing argues for a generous implementation schedule, particularly at the stage where we are working to integrate the three required information systems (AMR, CIS, and alert system) to communicate smoothly.

The USBR award notification did not indicate when we might expect a formal agreement, but it would be advantageous to streamline the administrative acceptance process to the extent feasible to avoid unnecessary start-up delays. To that end, we recommend that the Board of Directors authorize the General Manager to accept the grant on behalf of the District and enter into a formal agreement with the USBR to execute the project if the agreement is acceptable to the General Manager and District Counsel.

[1] Staff has also applied for AMI co-funding through the MWD of Southern California, but the selection process has been delayed while MWD reviews its conservation funds and programs in light of last fiscal year's rebate fund over-subscription.

COMMUNICATIONS COMMITTEE - STANDING/LIMITED

MEETINGS ARE HELD 4 TIMES A YEAR

- One at both the Fall and Spring conferences
- One at the Sacramento office between conferences
- One at a member agencies site between conferences

The purpose of the ACWA Communications Committee is to develop and make recommendations to the Board of Director's and association staff regarding comprehensive internal and external communications/public affairs programs. Programs are crafted to support ACWA and its members' positions on legislative, regulatory, and policy issues.

The committee is responsible for developing and updating a comprehensive communications plan for ACWA. The committee promotes the development and implementation of sound public information and education programs and practices among member agencies. It prepares materials that can be duplicated or used by member agencies for their local public information/education efforts. As a member of the committee, you will be enrolled as an active participant in ACWA's Outreach Program. The committee also provides guidance to ACWA's Communications Department.

ENERGY COMMITTEE - STANDING/UNLIMITED

MEETINGS ARE HELD 2 TIMES A YEAR

One at both the Fall and Spring conferences

The purpose of the Energy Committee is to work with staff in developing and making recommendations to the Board of Directors regarding:

- Programs to assure an adequate power supply for member agencies, including energy, availability, pricing, distribution and hydro generation
- Policy recommendations relating to the development of new power sources
- Recommended positions regarding state and federal legislation to the State Legislative and Federal Affairs Committees
- Assistance with the development, direction and work associated with representation before the Public Utilities Commission, the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission and other regulatory agencies dealing with energy
- Educate members on all energy matters having impact on their operations

FEDERAL AFFAIRS COMMITTEE - STANDING/LIMITED

MEETINGS ARE HELD 4 TIMES A YEAR

- One at both the Fall and Spring conferences
- Two between conferences (Jan & Sept) in the Sacramento office

The Federal Affairs Committee coordinates with other ACWA committees regarding their input on any issues directly related to federal issues before both Congress and the Federal administrative branches. As a member of the committee, you will be enrolled as an active participant in ACWA's Outreach Program.

INSURANCE AND PERSONNEL COMMITTEE - STANDING/LIMITED

MEETINGS ARE HELD 4 TIMES A YEAR

- One at both the Fall and Spring conferences
- One in April in the Sacramento office
- One in July in Southern California

The Insurance and Personnel Committee works with staff in developing, reviewing and making recommendations to the Board of Directors regarding the following:

- All ACWA group insurance program offerings
- Annual contract negotiations and renewal of all group employee benefit plans.
- Sponsor special studies on insurance-related problems and issues
- Sponsor safety programs for risk management or workers' compensation claims
- Define the scope of any audit to be performed by an independent actuary, as needed
- Gather, develop and publish comparative data on salary ranges, employee benefits and other personnel and administrative data pertinent to the management of member agencies

LEGAL AFFAIRS COMMITTEE - STANDING/LIMITED

MEETINGS ARE HELD APPROXIMATELY 2-3 TIMES A YEAR

- One at both the Fall and Spring conferences
- As needed in between the conferences

LEGAL AFFAIRS COMMITTEE - CONTINUED

The committee's primary purpose is to support the mission of the Association, and more particularly, to deal with requests for assistance involving legal matters of significance to ACWA member agencies, water rights matters, proposed ACWA bylaw revisions, etc.

The committee also works with staff to produce publications to assist water agency officials in complying with applicable state and federal laws. The committee's areas of responsibility include:

- Amicus curia filings on important cases
- Commenting on proposed regulations and guidelines of state agencies such as Fair Political Practices Commission regulations or opinions and CEQA implementation guidelines
- Entering a suit as primary litigant
- Dealing with any water rights matters of interest to member agencies
- Reviewing all proposed ACWA bylaws for technical competence and consistency with the nonprofit corporation law and other bylaws

LOCAL GOVERNMENT COMMITTEE - STANDING/LIMITED

MEETINGS ARE HELD 4 TIMES A YEAR

- One at both the Fall and Spring conferences
- Two in between the conferences in the Sacramento office

The Local Government Committee:

- Recommends policies to the State Legislative Committee and the Board of Directors on matters affecting water agencies as a segment of local government in California, such as planning issues and local government organization and finance
- Plans and presents a program at each ACWA conference relating to local governance issues affecting water agencies
- Gathers data and disseminates information on the value of special districts
- Disseminates information promoting excellence in service delivery
- As a member of the committee, you will be enrolled as an active participant in ACWA's Outreach Program.

MEMBERSHIP COMMITTEE - REGULAR/UNLIMITED

MEETINGS ARE HELD 2 TIMES A YEAR

• One at both the Fall and Spring conferences

The Membership Committee takes any recommendation regarding ACWA policy to the ACWA Board of Directors for approval, meets to review and make recommendations regarding membership eligibility and all membership applications; assists the staff with the development of recruitment and retention programs and reviews and makes recommendations regarding an equitable dues structure to the ACWA Finance Committee.

STATE LEGISLATIVE COMMITTEE - STANDING/LIMITED MEETINGS ARE HELD APPROXIMATELY 10-12 TIMES A YEAR

- Every three weeks during Session in the Sacramento Office
- One planning meeting at the end of the year in the Sacramento Office

The State Legislative committee sets state legislative policy for the Associations. Committee members are responsible for reading relevant legislation, developing positions, working with staff to draft appropriate amendments to bills, providing input to the ACWA Board of Directors, and directing ACWA legislative staff on legislative matters. As a member of the committee, you will be enrolled as an active participant in ACWA's Outreach Program.

WATER MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE - STANDING/LIMITED MEETINGS ARE HELD 4 TIMES A YEAR

- One at both the Fall and Spring conferences
- Two between conferences in the Sacramento office

The purpose of the Water Management Committee is to work with staff in developing and making recommendations to the Board of Directors regarding policy and programs on significant areas of concern in water management, review and recommend positions regarding legislation and regulations as requested by other committees, select recipients of the Theodore Roosevelt Environmental Awards.

The committee is also responsible for the gathering and dissemination of information regarding management of agricultural and domestic water, conjunctive use, water management and conservation activities, development and use of water resources, and wastewater treatment and its reclamation and reuse. As a member of the committee, you will be enrolled as an active participant in ACWA's Outreach Program.

WATER QUALITY COMMITTEE - STANDING/UNLIMITED MEETINGS ARE HELD BY SUBCOMMITTEES

Water Quality Committee was established to recommend policy and programs to the Board of Directors, State Legislative Committee and/or Federal Affairs Committee; promote cost effective state and federal water quality regulations affecting both agricultural and domestic water agencies; and provide a means for members to work together to develop and present unified comments on water quality regulations, as well as to coordinate with other organizations. The ACWA bylaws provide authority to the committee to develop and recommend ACWA positions and testimony on water quality regulatory issues.
