DISCUSSION

Russ Randle from Patton Boggs will provide a legislative update.

For 2010, Patton Boggs proposes to seek funding for recycled water projects under the US Army Corps of Engineers appropriations bill (using the existing WRDA 219 authorization), under the EPA's state and tribal assistance grants (STAG) program, and for grant funding under the Bureau of Reclamation's challenge grant program, including possible earmarked funding for specific projects not yet covered by a Title XVI authorization. Patton Boggs is also prepared to respond should there be additional project funding opportunities if another economic stimulus package is adopted.

They will also be following Clean Water Act Reauthorization efforts concerning the "waters of the United States" definition, as that language may affect the use of recycled water, and be monitoring grant opportunities from the Department of Energy for clean technologies, as well as potential grants from NOAA and Department of the Interior for possible biological and other studies, such as the research being conducted by Dr. Randal Orton.

Mr. Randle will be prepared to answer any questions the JPA may have.

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MINUTES OF A MEETING OF THE GOVERNING BOARD OF THE LAS VIRGENES-TRIUNFO JOINT POWERS AUTHORITY HELD ON SEPTEMBER 14, 2009

The governing board of the Las Virgenes-Triunfo Joint Powers Authority met in a Meeting at Oak Park Library, 899 North Kanan Road, Oak Park, California, 91377 at 5:00 p.m. on Monday, September 14, 2009.

Vice Chair Caspary called the meeting to order at 5:00 p.m.

The Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag was given, led by Director Renger.

Vice Chair Caspary called the roll. Directors present were: Gillette, Glancy, Parks, Paule, Bowman, Caspary, Smith and Renger.

Directors not present: Directors Orkney and Peterson; excused.

Vice Chair declared a quorum present.

- Administering Agent/General Manager Mundy stated there were two changes to the agenda. Change the order of item #4 and pull item #6A to be brought back to the JPA Board by the end of the year. It was then moved by Director Glancy, seconded by Director Renger and unanimously carried, that the agenda for the September 14, 2009 meeting be approved as amended.
- 3 Public Forum: No speaker cards were received from the public.
- Illustrative and/or Verbal Presentation Agenda Items: Public Affairs Associate Low presented the Environmental Water Science Workshop 2009. Resource Conservation Manager Orton provided a Watershed update. Administering Agent/General Manager Mundy introduced Brett Dingman, the new Reclamation Manager.
- 5 Consent Calendar: It was moved by Director Bowman seconded by Director Paule, and unanimously carried, that the Minutes of the Las Virgenes Triunfo Joint Powers Authority Meetings of June 1, 2009 and July 6, 2009, be approved and adopted as presented.

SUMMARY

The results of the first quarter revenue and expenses for FY09/10 are encouraging. Although operating revenues are smaller than expected by the budget, the first two months of the summer were not as warm as the prior year and recycled water users may have been applying the conservation standards they were using for potable water to recycled water also. Operating expenses were below budget in seven out of nine divisions, and the difference in the two divisions slightly over budget was minimal. Overall operating expenses were less than budget by 15%. However, it is too early in the year to assume that this good news will continue unabated.

Capital project expenses are lower than prior year at the same time due to the timing of major projects in each fiscal year.

RECOMMENDATION

Receive and file.

DISCUSSION

The capital project expense for the Nitrogen Compliance project primarily took place in FY08/09 and is winding down in the current year. The expected completion date is November 2009.

The largest capital project budgeted for FY09/10 is the 24" recycled water pipeline project, which is currently in its early stages.

This report reflects the corrections staff made on the budget for allocated support services and allocated operating services. The correction reflects a reallocation between LVMWD and JPA that came to light during fiscal yearend closing. The revised budget has lower allocated support services and higher allocated operations services with a total JPA increase of \$522,230, allocating \$368,694 to LVMWD and \$153,536 to TSD.

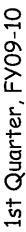

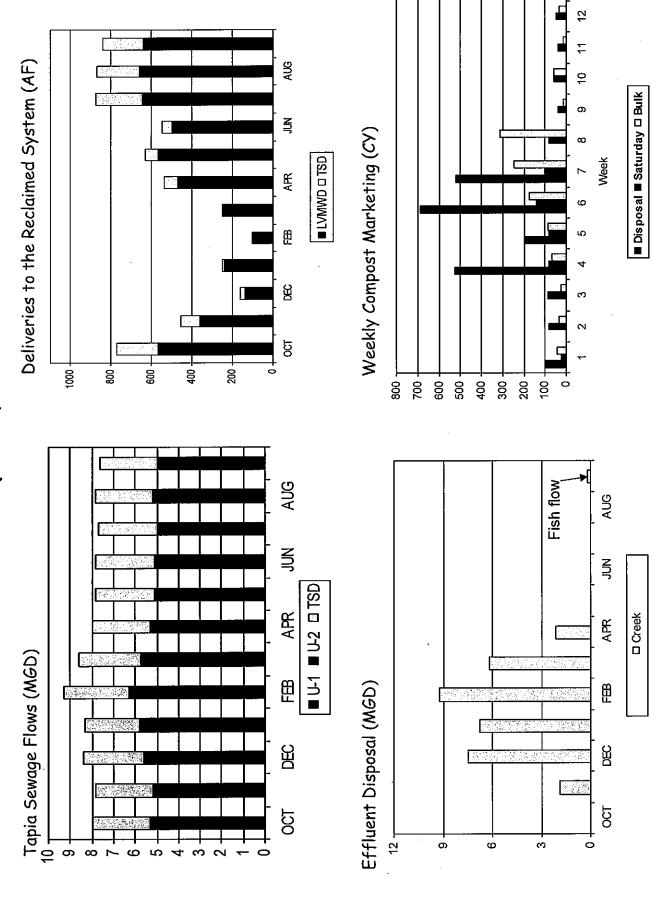

Phase I and II: Acceptance

Las Virgenes-Triunfo Joint Powers Authority approved funding for this matter in the Joint Powers Authority Budget. The Las Virgenes Board, as the administering agent, ratified Change Order No. 6 as a no-cost time extension of an additional 14 calendar days; approved the execution of a Notice of Completion by the Secretary of the Board for and on behalf of the District and have the same recorded for each project; approved the final Progress Payment, in the amount of \$10,190.70 to Spiess Construction Company, Inc; and in the absence of claims from subcontractors and others, released retention in the amount of \$334,358.86 thirty calendar days after filing the Notice of Completion for the Tapia Water Reclamation Facility Biological Nutrient Reduction Project Phase I at their October 13, 2009 meeting. Additionally, the administering agent approved the final Progress Payment in the amount of \$5,560.20 to Spiess Construction Company, Inc; and in the absence of claims from subcontractors and others, released retention in the amount of \$37,826.00 thirty calendar days after filing the Notice of Completion for the Tapia Water Reclamation Facility Biological Nutrient Reduction Project Phase II at their October 13, 2009 meeting.

SUMMARY

At the April 7, 2008 JPA meeting and at the January 27, 2009 LVMWD meeting, the Boards awarded the Tapia Water Reclamation Facility Biological Nutrient Reduction Project Phase I and then Phase II to Spiess Construction Company, Inc. These Projects modify existing facilities at Tapia and add new equipment to help reduce nitrogen levels in Tapia's effluent. The scope of the projects included the installation of pumps, mixers, sludge collection equipment, gates, electrical equipment, piping and prepurchased swing arm diffusers. The BNR Phase I project provides RAS treatment, as well as modifications to improve the reliability of nitrogen removal in the aeration basins. The BNR Phase II project provides reliability with the replacement of several basin gates.

There were a total of six change orders for the BNR Phase I project. The total cost of these change orders was \$97,819.07. Change Order No. 6 was a no cost two week time extension to account for delays in the delivery of sludge collection equipment installed in primary clarifier #4.

FINANCIAL IMPACT

The Fiscal Year 08-09 and Fiscal Year 09-10 budgets provided funding for permit compliance under CIP Job #10184. Construction costs are broken down as follows:

Tapia Major Tertiary Filters Maintenance:

Authorization of Purchase Order

Las Virgenes-Triunfo Joint Powers Authority approved funding for this matter in the Joint Powers Authority Budget. The Las Virgenes Board, as the administering agent, waived the formal bidding process and authorized the General Manager/Administering Agent to issue a Purchase Order in an amount not to exceed \$55,000.00 to Carbon Activated Corporation for major maintenance of the tertiary filters at their October 13, 2009 meeting.

SUMMARY

One of the maintenance projects approved in the 2009-2010 budget is for major tertiary filter maintenance at the Tapia WRF. This is the fifth fiscal year in which two filters per year undergo major maintenance (there are a total of twelve filters). As the filters age they need of major maintenance, which consists of the removal, disposal and replacement of filter media and interior filter cleaning. It is unknown if repairs or replacement of the existing under drain systems in the filters are required until the media is removed, so the proposals received do not include under drain repair. Four proposals were requested from regional vendors that perform this work. The proposals received are as follows:

Carbon Activated Corporation \$27,500.00 per filter ERS Industrial Services, Inc. \$28,474.33 per filter BakerCorp \$29,204.00 per filter Prominent Systems, Inc. \$30,434.64 per filter

The FY 09-10 Tapia Maintenance budget of \$85,000.00 allows for the maintenance on two filters and provides some additional funding if minor under drain repair is necessary. It was recommended that Carbon Activated Corporation be issued a purchase order to provide major maintenance on two filters for the Tapia: Major Tertiary Filters Maintenance Project. If further repairs to the under drain system of the filters are necessary, they can be administratively approved under the same budgetary unit.

FINANCIAL IMPACT

The Fiscal Year 2009-10 budget allocates funds for Tapia maintenance under account number 751810.5430 in the amount of \$85,000.00. This project is a fixed based cost based on capacity rights in the treatment plant. As such, the cost split is 70.6% for LVMWD and 29.4% for Triunfo.

Authorization of Purchase Order

Las Virgenes-Triunfo Joint Powers Authority approved funding for this matter in the Joint Powers Authority Budget. The Las Virgenes Board, as the administering agent, waived the formal bidding process and authorized the General Manager/Administering Agent to issue a Purchase Order in an amount not to exceed \$38,000.00 to Carbon Activated Corporation for the replacement of granular activated carbon for one 6,000 lb carbon tower, one 18,000 lb carbon tower and the lift station's two 600 lb carbon scrubbers at their October 13, 2009 meeting.

SUMMARY

One of the maintenance projects approved in the 2009-2010 budget is the replacement of granular activated carbon in the carbon towers at Tapia which are used for odor control. There are four headworks and three primary carbon towers which need to have the carbon replaced regularly. This fiscal year, one primary carbon tower (6,000 lbs of carbon) and one headworks carbon tower (18,000 lbs of carbon) are scheduled for carbon replacement. Carbon life expectancy for the primary carbon towers is one to two years and for the headworks carbon towers is approximately two years. Additionally, there are two 600 lb. carbon scrubbers at the lift stations which require media replacement annually. The FY 09-10 budget contains \$35,000 for odor control at Tapia and \$5,000 for odor control at the lift stations. Three bids were requested and obtained for the performance of this work. Bids received were as follows:

Carbon Activated Corporation \$ 33,769.00
Baker Filtration \$ 41,432.00
Prominent Systems, Inc. \$ 36,509.00

It is recommended that Carbon Activated Corporation be issued a purchase order for granular activated carbon replacement for one 6,000 lb carbon tower, one 18,000 lb carbon tower and the lift station's two 600 lb carbon scrubbers. The 9.75% sales tax was not included in the quotations, but is included in the purchase order amount.

FINANCIAL IMPACT

The Fiscal Year 2009-10 budget allocates funds for this project in the Tapia budget under account 751810.5417 in the amount of \$44,000.00, and under the Las Virgenes Sanitation budget (lift stations) under account 130100.5417 in the amount of \$5,000.00. The lift stations are an LV only expense and the carbon towers are a JPA expense.

Las Virgenes-Triunfo Joint Powers Authority approved funding for this matter in the Joint Powers Authority Budget. The Las Virgenes Board, as the administering agent, Ratified Change Order No. 6 in the amount of \$30,398.92; approved the execution of a Notice of Completion by the Secretary of the Board; approved the final Progress Payment, in the amount of \$54,118.80 to Pascal & Ludwig Constructors; and in the absence of claims from subcontractors and others, released retention in the amount of \$194,192.06 within thirty calendar days after filing the Notice of Completion for the Tapia Water Reclamation Facility BNR Centrate Treatment Project at their October 13, 2009 meeting.

SUMMARY

At the March 11, 2008 Board meeting, the Board awarded the Tapia Water Reclamation Facility BNR Centrate Treatment Project to Pascal & Ludwig Constructors. The Centrate Treatment Project modified the existing "farm" tanks by adding new equipment so that the centrate generated at the Rancho Las Virgenes Composting Facility can be treated to remove nitrogen before it is discharged to Tapia. This project included the installation of a pre-purchased jet aeration system in the tanks which provides mixing and aeration of the centrate, promoting nitrogen removal. Ancillary work for centrate treatment included the installation of pumps, blowers, meters, probes, and piping modifications, site work and electrical and controls modifications.

The centrate treatment process was placed into service in late August. Initial results indicating nitrogen reduction in the centrate are encouraging. However, it is expected to be several months before the biology in the tanks stabilizes and consistent and reliable results are achieved.

There were a total of six change orders during the course of this project totaling \$114,325.00. Change Order No. 6 was administratively approved in the amount of \$30,398.92 to account for miscellaneous items which were addressed during the project.

The completion of this project concludes the work required in the contract documents and it is appropriate at this time to file a Notice of Completion, make final payment, and release retention as stipulated in the contract documents.

FINANCIAL IMPACT

The Fiscal Year 08-09 and Fiscal Year 09-10 Budgets provided funding for permit compliance under CIP Job #10184. Construction costs are broken down as follows:

Contract Acceptance and Release of Retention

Las Virgenes-Triunfo Joint Powers Authority approved funding for this matter in the Joint Powers Authority Budget. The Las Virgenes Board, as the administering agent, ratified Change Order No. 1 as a no-cost total extension of 112 days; approved the execution of a Notice of Completion by the Secretary of the Board; and in the absence of claims from subcontractors and others, released the retention in the amount of \$7,047.00 to Timothy J. Ferrie, Inc.; within thirty-five calendar days after filing the Notice of Completion for the El Cañon Sewer Plug and Manhole Improvements Project at their October 13, 2009 meeting.

<u>SUMMARY</u>

The District's manhole on El Cañon Ave. in Calabasas receives sewage flow via an existing 15" sewer from the Calabasas Unit B sewer serving the Mulwood area. The average flow is approximately 2 MGD. During normal operation, the difference in elevation between the District and City of Los Angeles inlets have allowed unintended overflows to the City, resulting in a significant cost to the District. This project was awarded by the Board to the contractor, Timothy J. Ferrie, Inc. on March 24, 2009. Special fabrication and extended delivery times of components delayed execution of contract; this necessitated a time only, no cost change order to the contract. The project involved the installation of a valve and a weir gate, achieved after first setting up a temporary bypass. All construction work was completed earlier this month, under inspection by Technical Services staff. The District is now able to control flow to the City of Los Angeles, preventing the unintended overflows and now realizing cost savings. The above project is now ready for acceptance, followed by the filing of the Notice of Completion, making the final payment, and releasing retention according to terms stipulated in the contract.

FINANCIAL IMPACT

None. Project funding was adequate to complete the work within budget.
